**Special Bono Region Poll:
Berekum East, Berekum
West, Sunyani East & Sunyani
West constituencies-
23rd July 2024**

Executive Summary

- ❑ A special poll conducted in Berekum East, Berekum West, Sunyani East and Sunyani West in the Bono region shows voters dissatisfaction with the direction of the country as 81% say Ghana is headed in the wrong direction while 12% say it is headed in the right direction. 7% did not have an opinion.
- ❑ 57% of voters say their living standard has worsened compared to a year ago while 10% say it has improved and 29% say it is unchanged. 4% did not have an opinion.
- ❑ 69% of voters disapprove of the job performance of the president while 25% approve and 6% did not have an opinion.
- ❑ On the question of who is the best-ever head/president of Ghana, Dr Kwame Nkrumah placed first with 53% of the mentions, followed by John Agyekum Kufour, 48%, Jerry John Rawling, 40%, Prof. John Evans Atta-Mills, 20%, John Mahama, 17%, Nana Akufo-Addo, 15%, Edward Akufo Addo, 1% and Dr Hilla Liman, 1%.

- ❑ For the 2024 presidential election, Dr Mahamudu Bawumia (DMB) leads with 47%, John Dramani Mahama (JDM), 42%, Alan Kwadwo Kyeremanten (AKK), 7% and Nana Kwame Bediako (NKB), 4%.
- ❑ Analysis of the poll shows that among respondent who voted in the 2020 elections, 67% voted for Nana Addo, 24% for John Mahama, 1% for someone else and 8% declined to disclose who they voted for.
- ❑ The poll however shows JDM leads in Berekum East 48% to 43%, Berekum West 49% to 42%, and Sunyani West 48% to 30%. However, DMB leads in Sunyani East 70% to 26%.
- ❑ Overall, using the committed voters' model, the presidential poll shows that 68% of voters who voted for Nana Addo in 2020 election intend to vote for DMB while 20% have switched their votes to JDM, 8% to AKK, 3% to NKB and 1% for others.
- ❑ In the case of JDM, 89% of his voters will still vote for him, 10% will vote DMB, 1% for AKK, 1% for NKB and 1% for others.
- ❑ However, in the parliamentary elections, the polls shows the ruling party could lose all the four seats as the incumbent MPs come under siege as desertion and apathy hit the party in the region.

- ❑ In Berekum East, Simon Kyeremeh, NDC, leads with 53%, incumbent, Hon. Nelson Kyeremeh, NPP, 38%, 2% will vote for other candidates and 7% are undecided. The poll also shows that 35% of voters who voted for Nelson Kyeremeh in the 2020 elections have switched their votes to Simon Kyeremeh of NDC, 51% of his 2020 voters intend to vote for him again, 3% will vote for others, 7% are undecided and 4% will not vote.
- ❑ In Berekum West, the incumbent, Hon. Kweku Agyenim Boateng trails his challenger, Dickson Kyere-Duah of the NDC 28% to 31%. 8% intend to vote for others and 34% are undecided. The poll also shows that 11% of voters who voted for Hon. Agyemang Boateng in the 2020 elections intend to vote for Kyere-Duah, only 26% of his 2020 voters intend to vote for him again, 5% will vote for others, 25% are undecided and 33% will not vote.
- ❑ In Sunyani East, an independent candidate, Ransford Antwi, has taken a strong lead as he polled 38% of the votes. Seid Mubarak, NDC, is in second place with 27% of the votes while Hon. Kwesi Ameyaw Cheremeh is in third place with 13% and 22% are undecided. The poll also shows that 14% of Hon Cheremeh's 2020 voters intend to vote for Seid Mubarak, NDC, 45% will vote for Ransford Antwi, the independent candidate. Only 14% of his voters indicated they intend to vote for him again while 20% are undecided and 5% will not vote.
- ❑ However, in Sunyani West, the Minister of Employment, Hon. Ignatius Baffour Awuah could be on his way out of parliament as he trails Millicent Yeboah Amankwaa 25% to 47%. 4% will vote for other candidates while 24% are undecided. At the time of the poll, it was unclear whether Bernard Oduro Takyie will contest as independent candidate in the constituency.
- ❑ Analysis of the poll shows that Baffour Awuah has lost 34% of his 2020 voters to Millicent Amankwaa of the NDC, only 34% of his 2020 voters intend to vote for him again while 3% will vote for others, 20% are undecided and 12% will not vote.

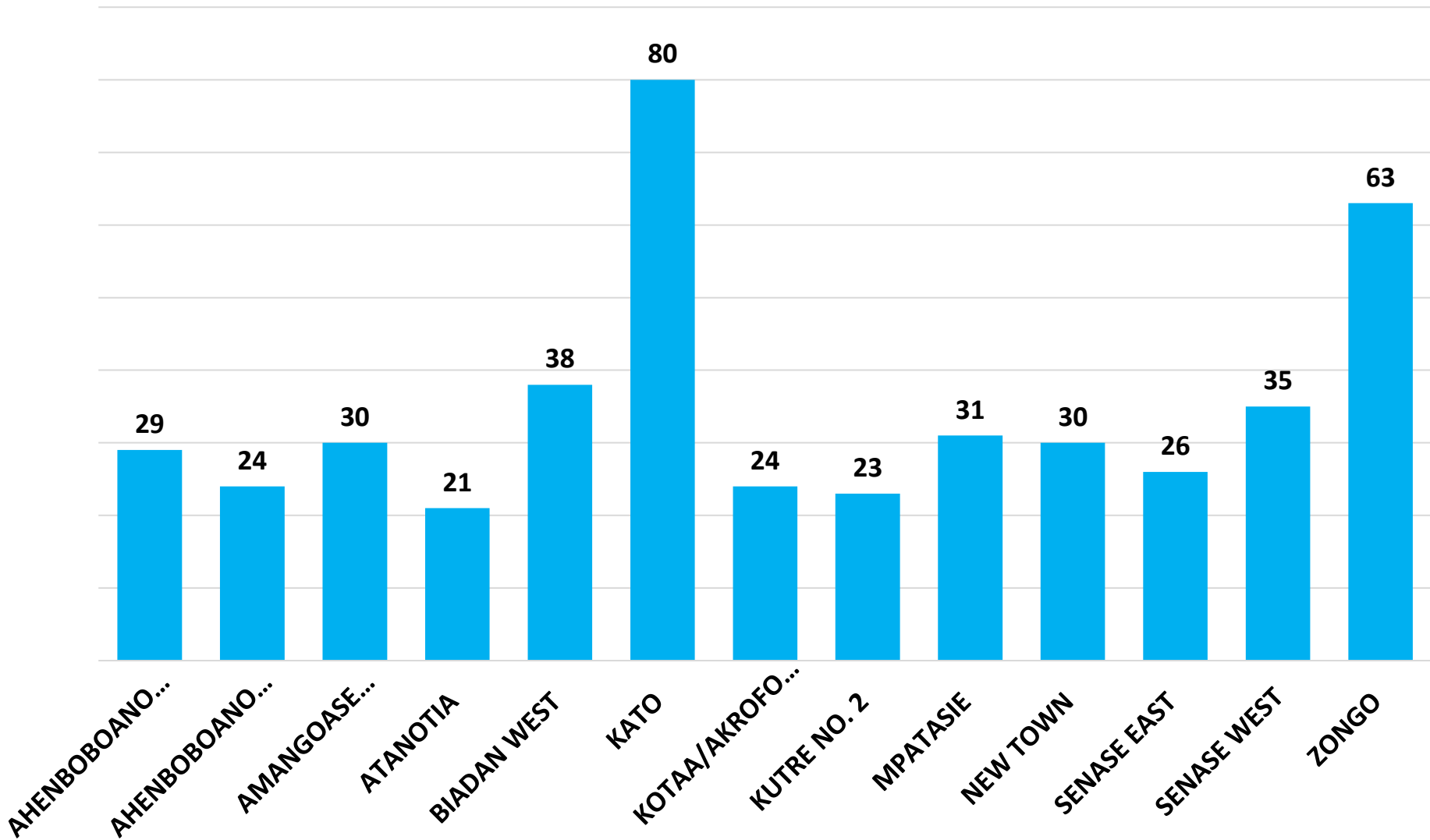
Methodology

- ❑ The Electoral Commission's 2020 voters' register was used as sample frame.
- ❑ Electoral areas sample were weighted using the voters register for the electoral areas
- ❑ Electoral Areas accounting for at least 70% of the total registered voters of the constituency were selected for the poll.
- ❑ Voters were sampled randomly from Electoral Areas of the constituencies
- ❑ Only registered voters were interviewed.
- ❑ Field interviews were conducted between 17th July to 22nd July 2024
- ❑ Demographic analysis of the results would have higher margin of error.

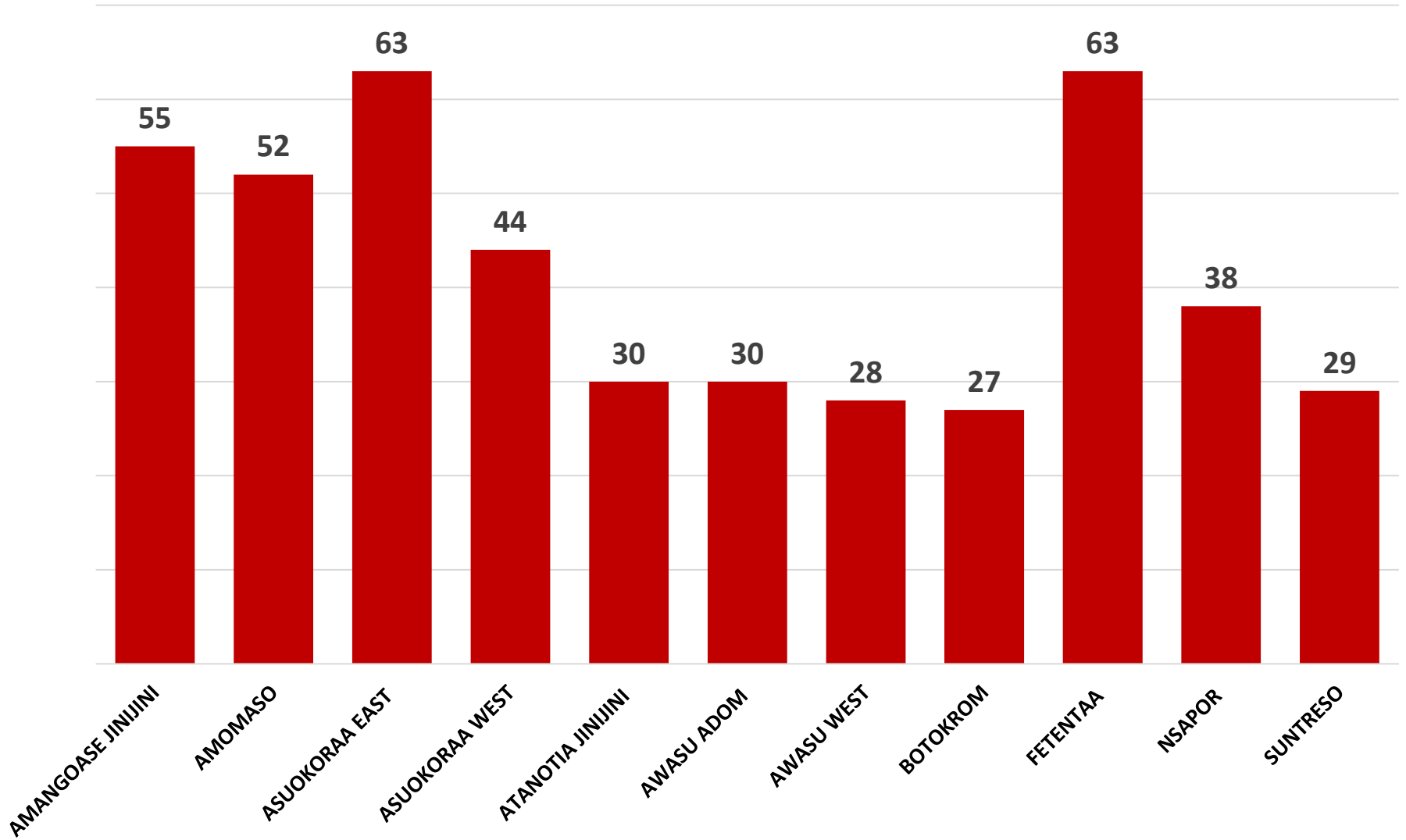

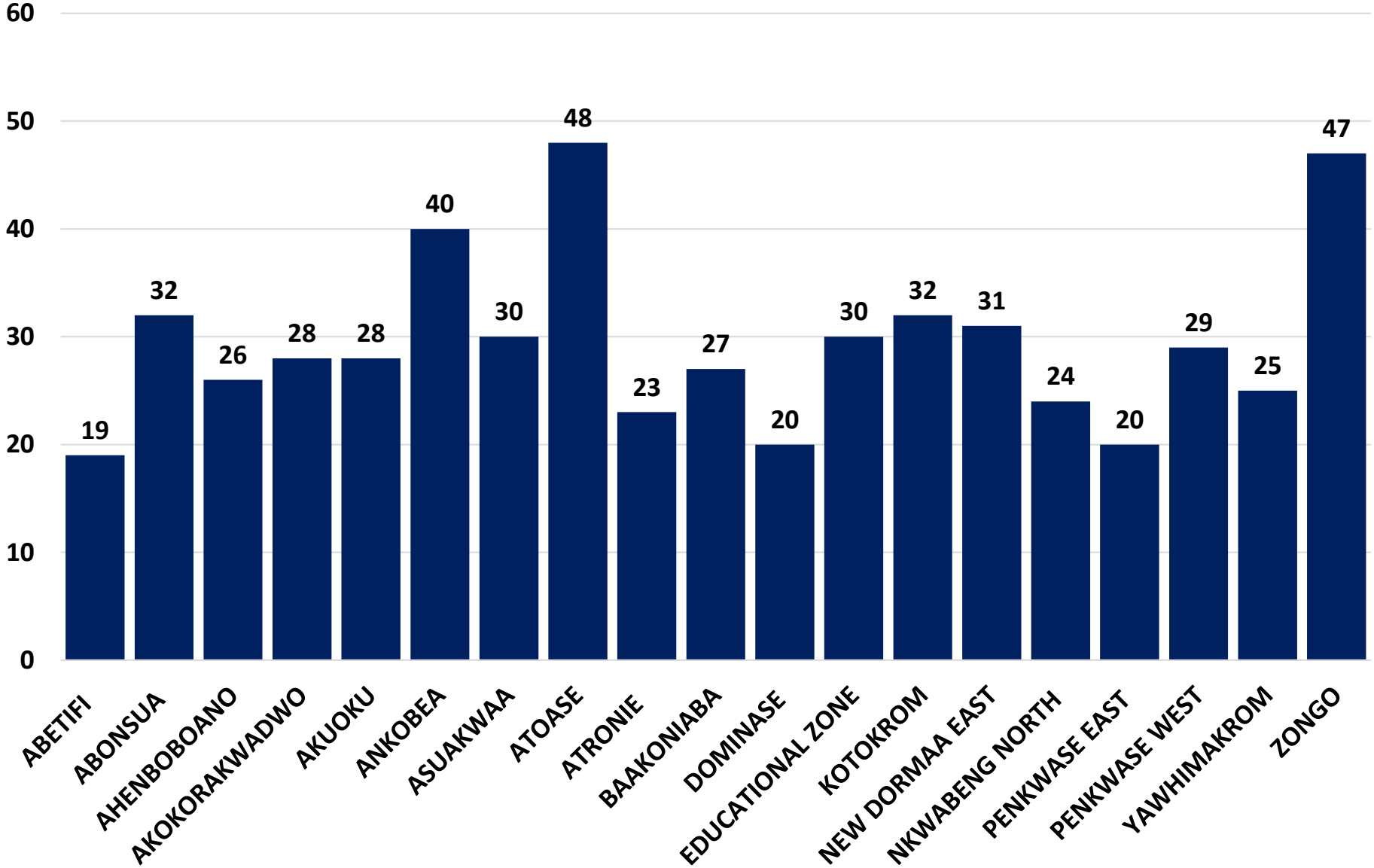
Electoral Areas Samples (Weighted)- Berekum East



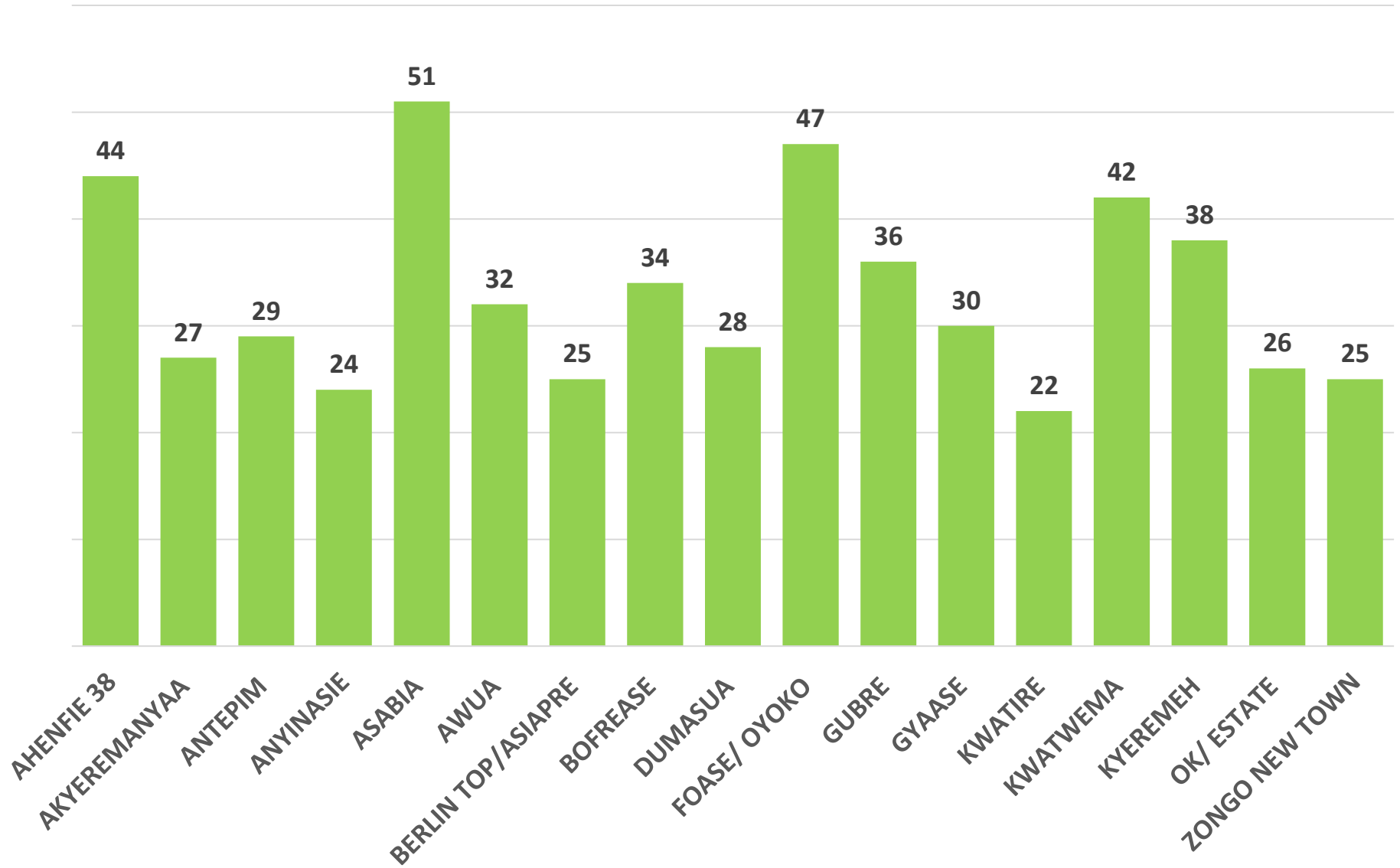
Electoral Areas Samples (Weighted)- Berekum West



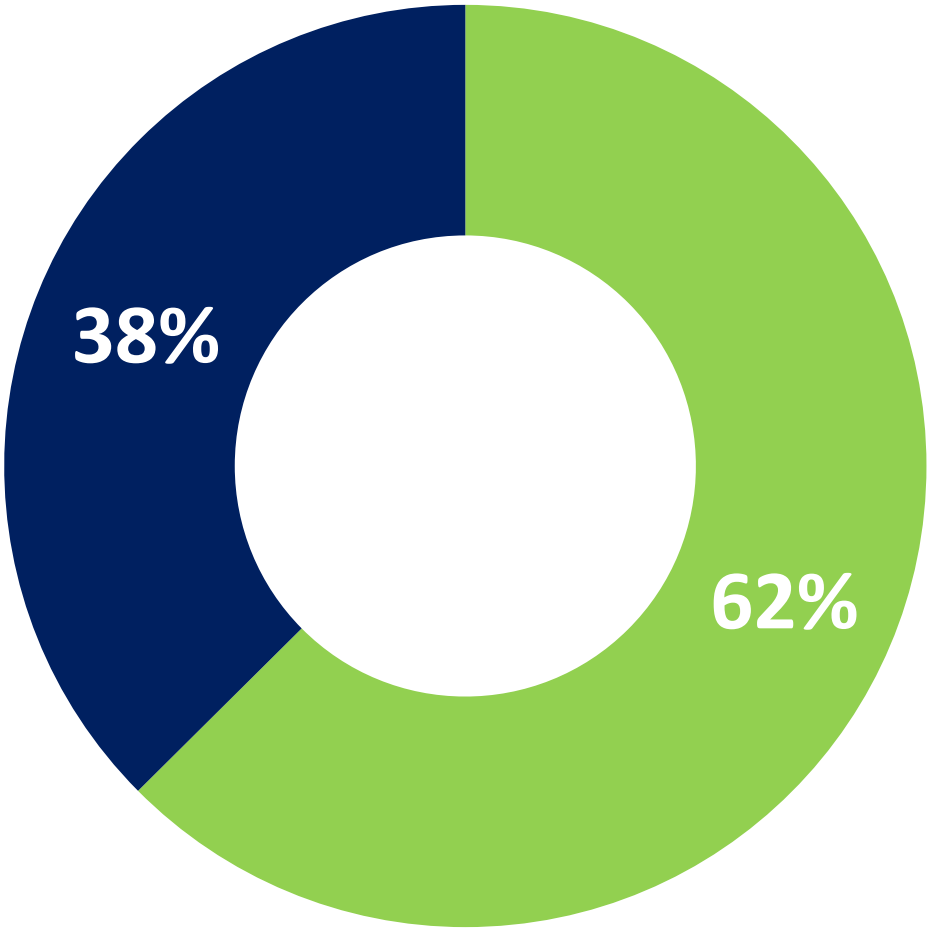
Electoral Areas Samples (Weighted)- Sunyani East



Electoral Areas Samples (Weighted)- Sunyani West



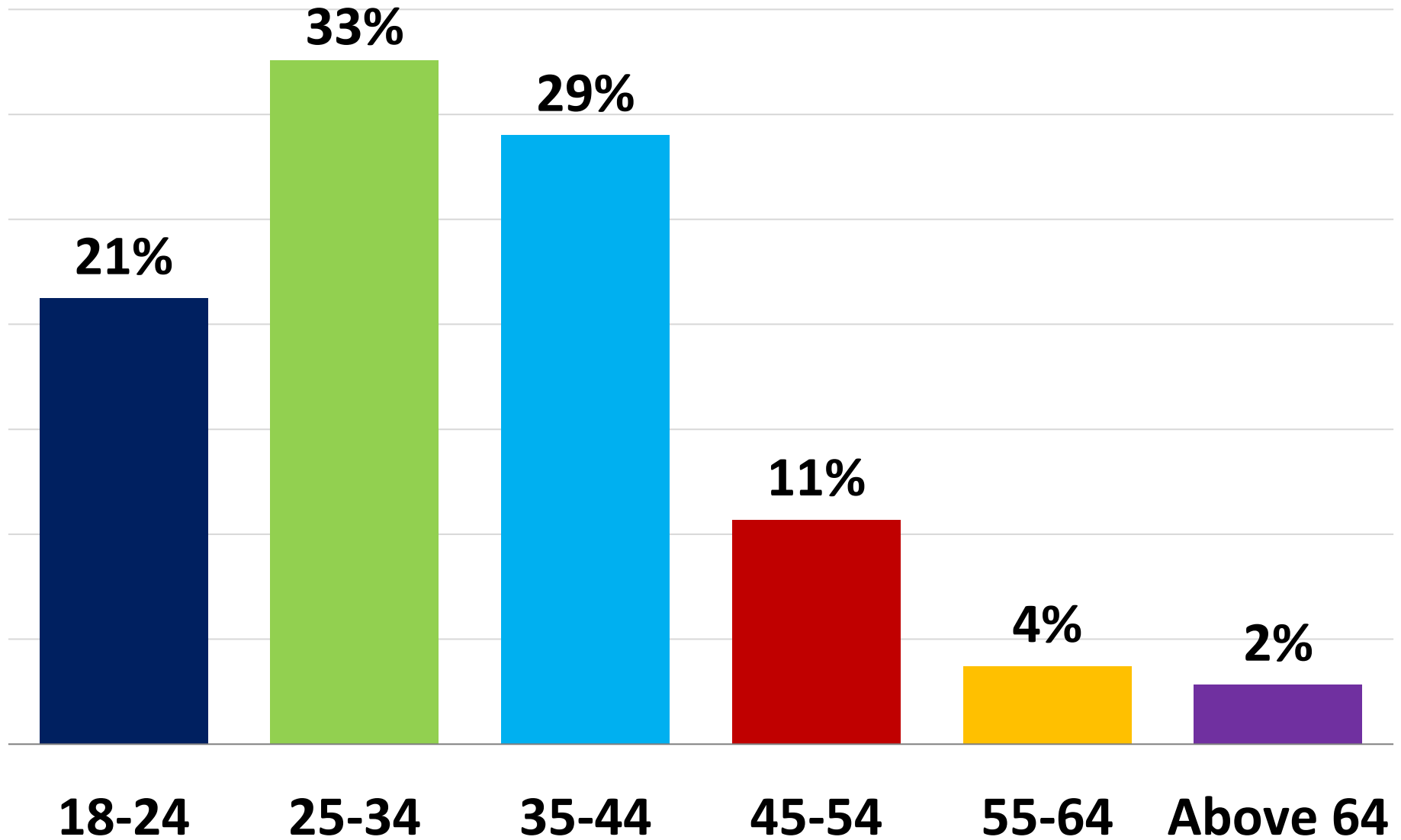

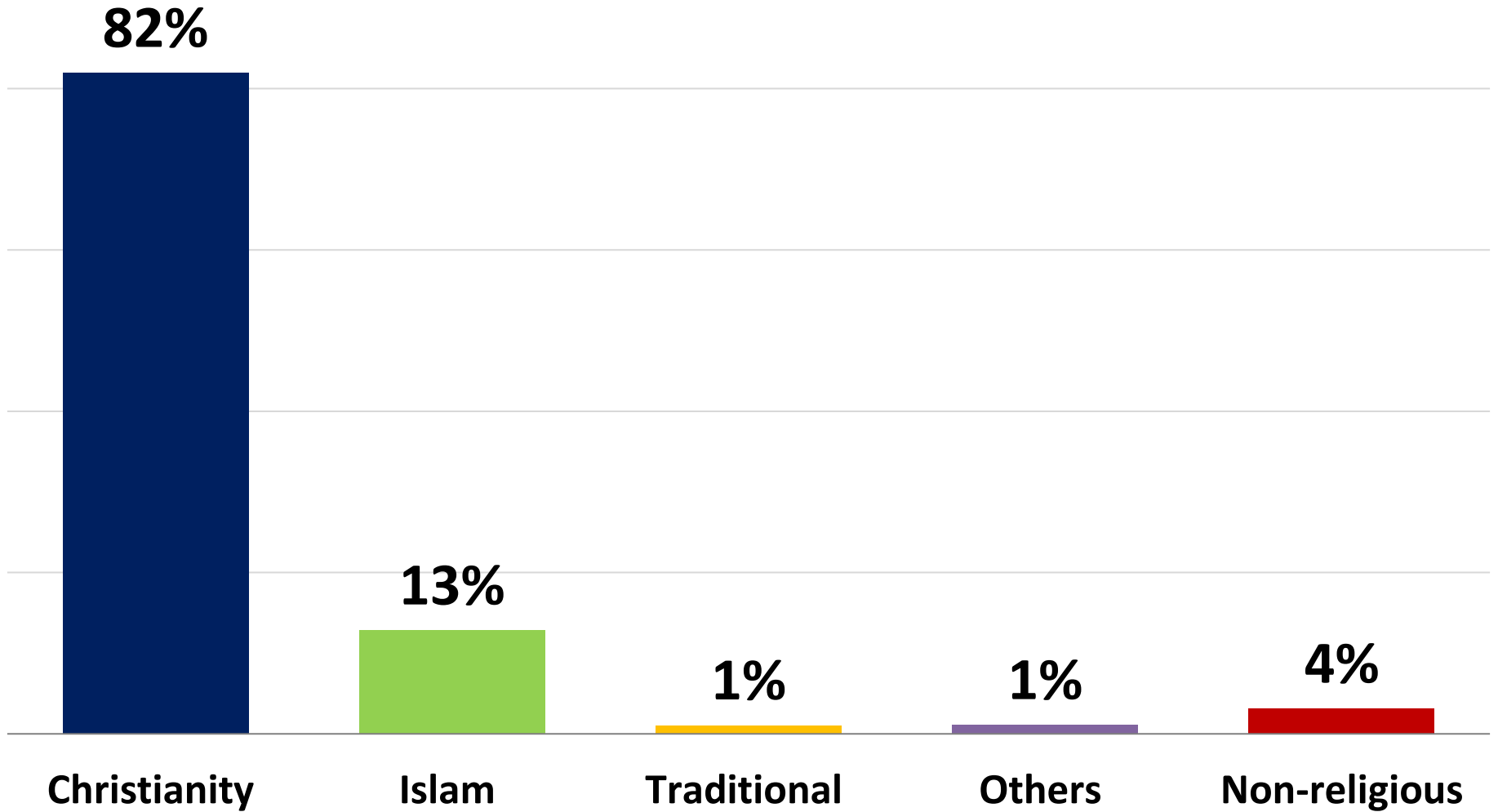

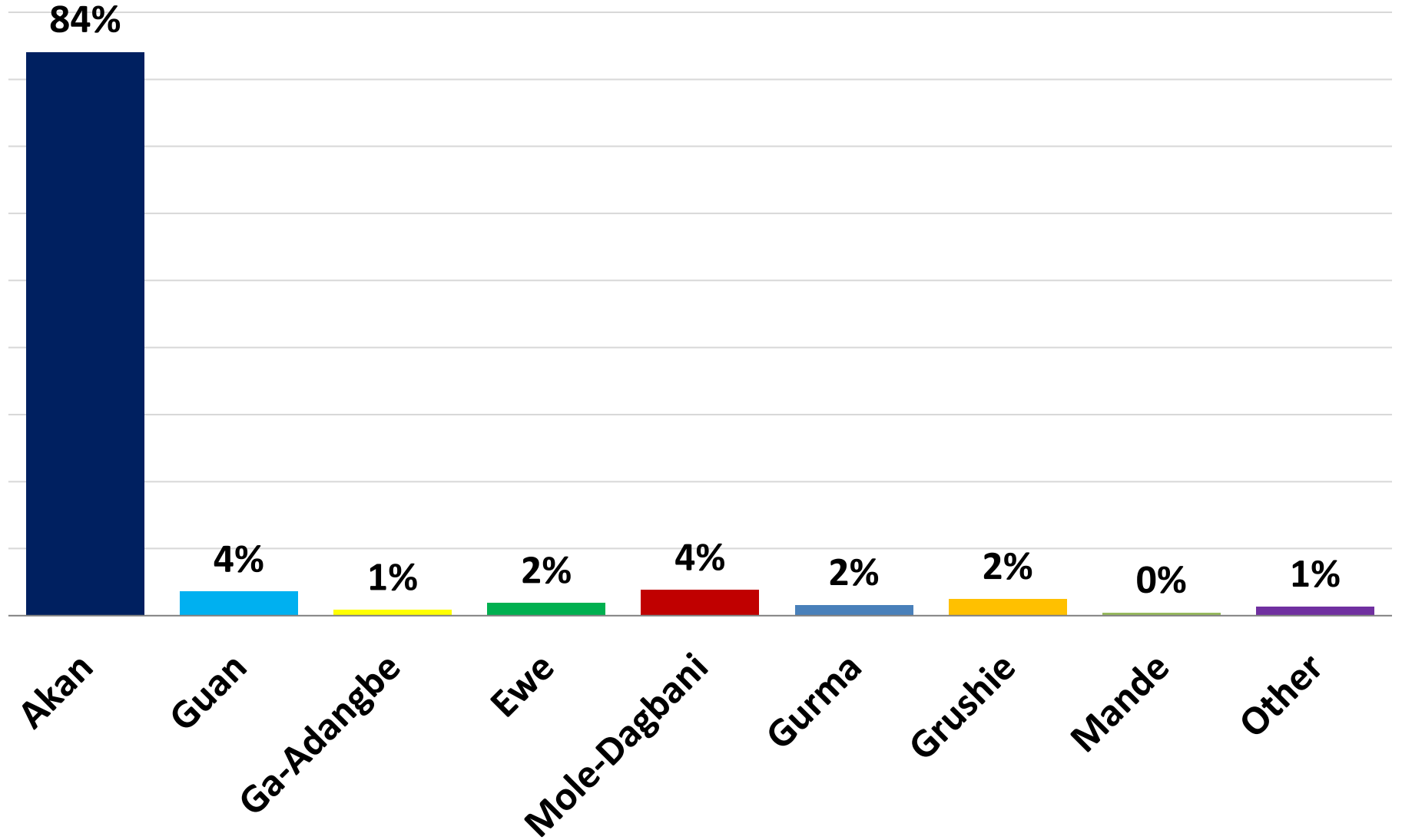

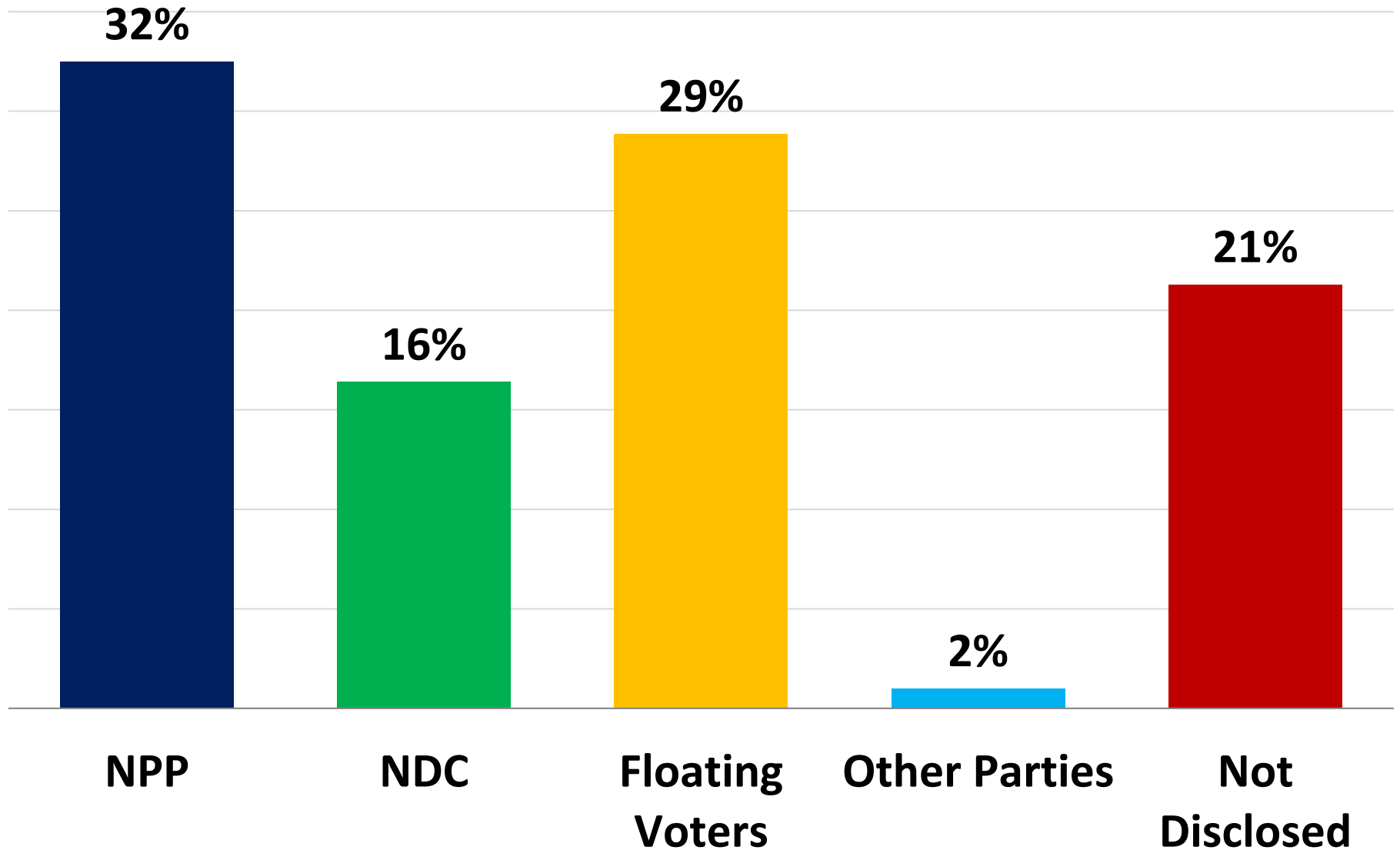

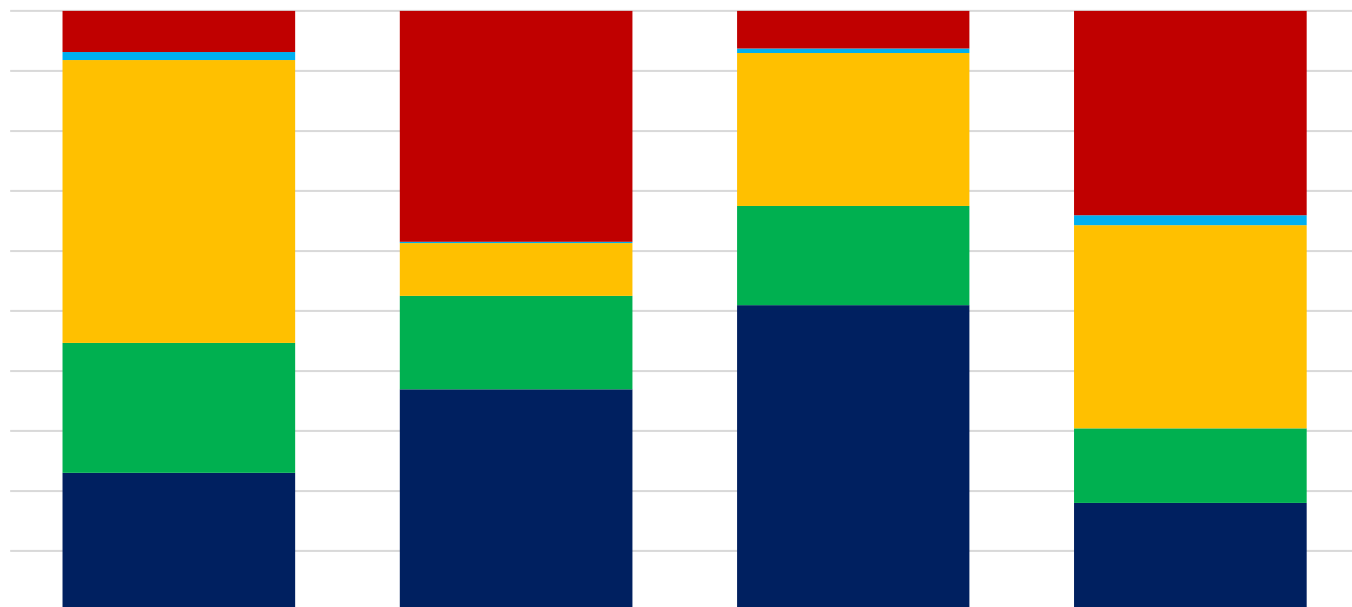

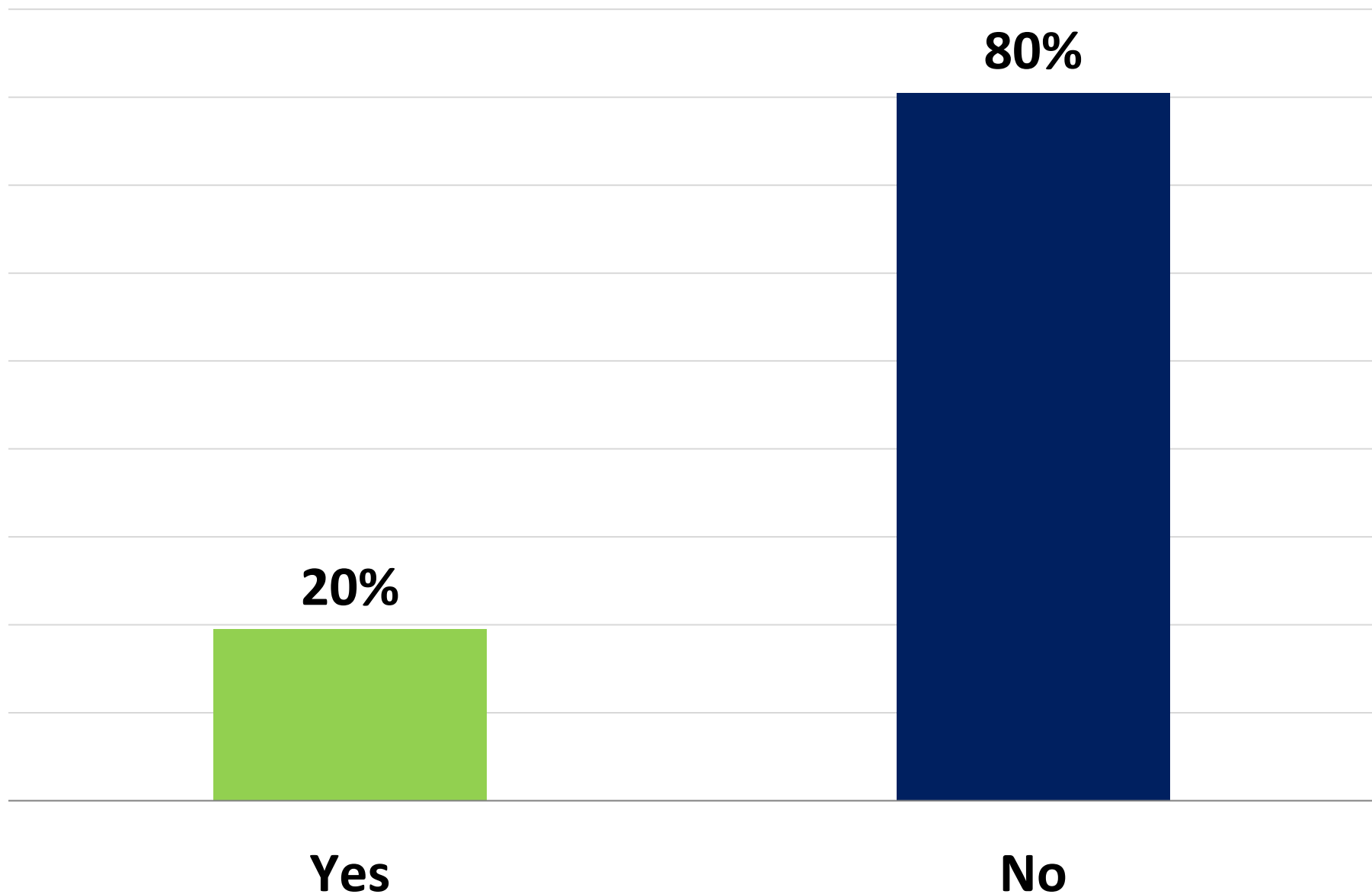

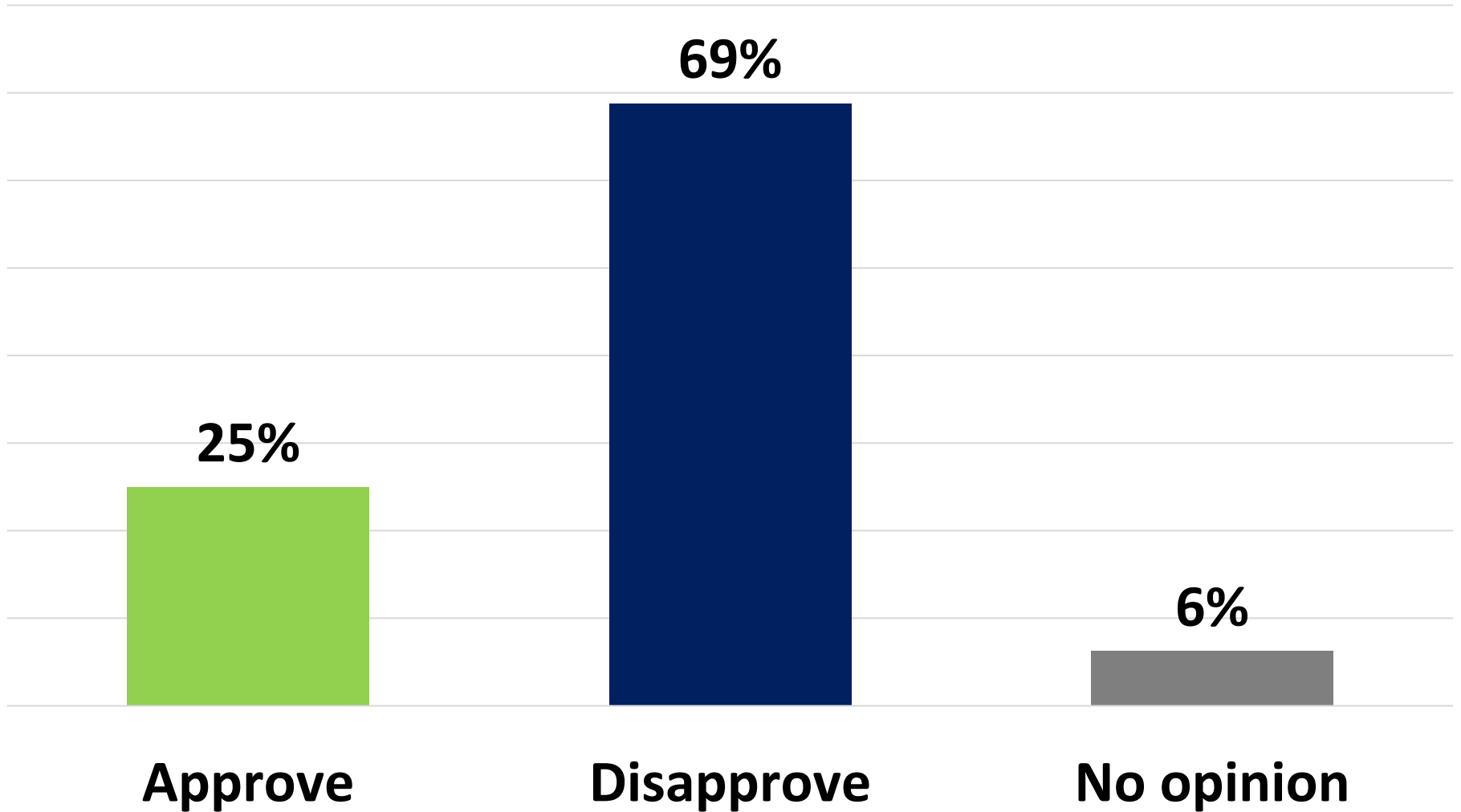
Are you a first-time voter?



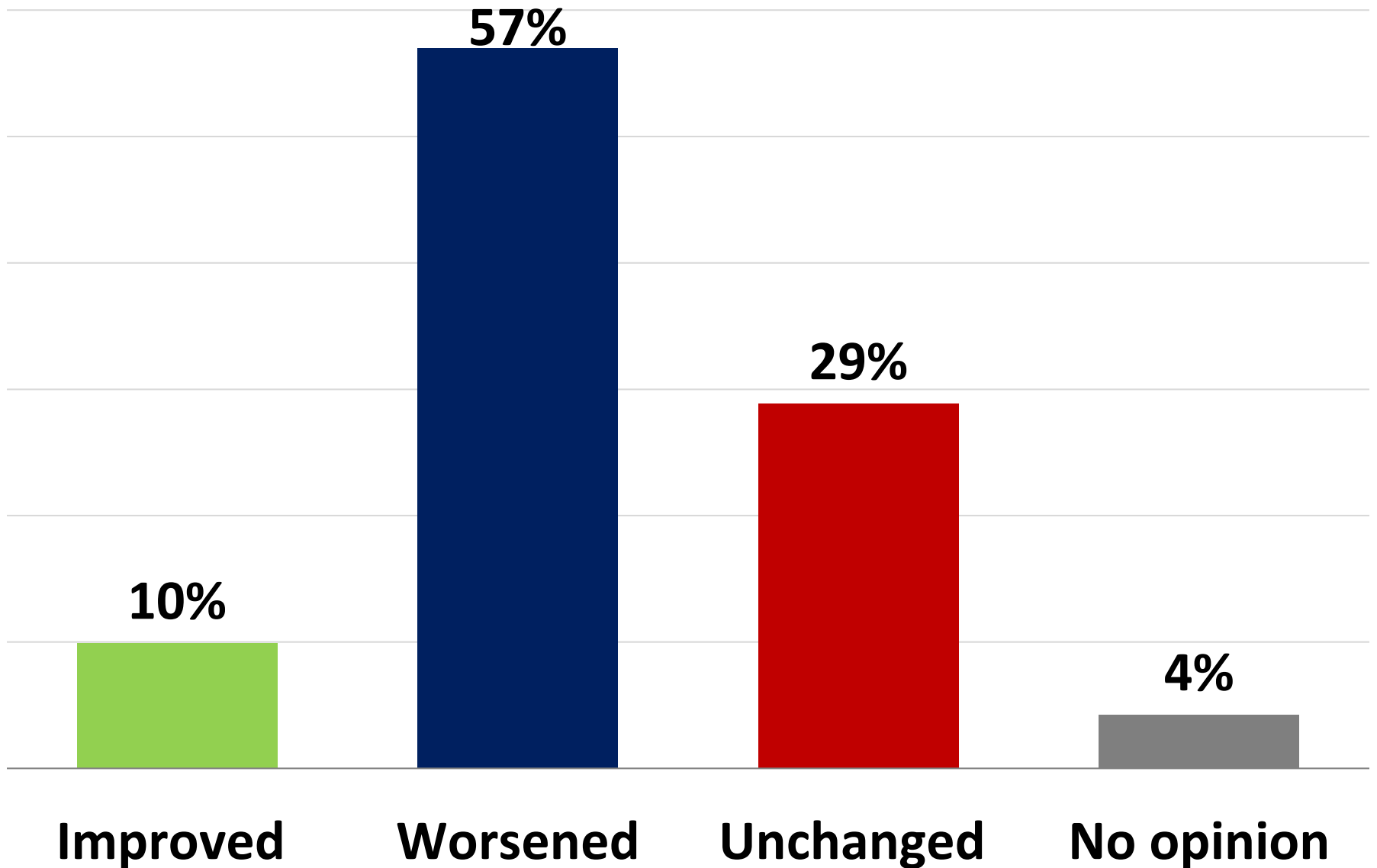
Would you say things in this country today are generally headed in the right direction or wrong direction?

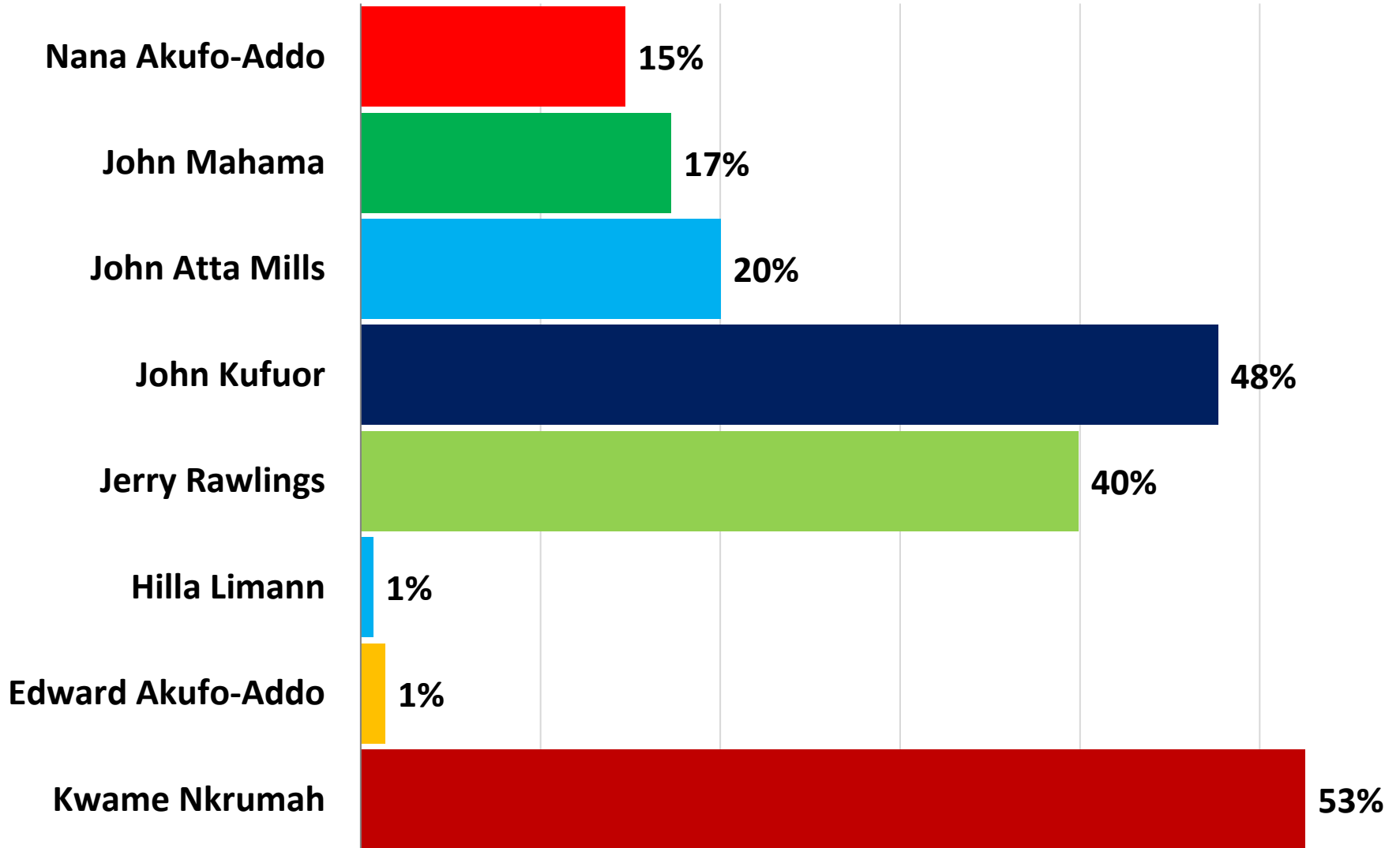

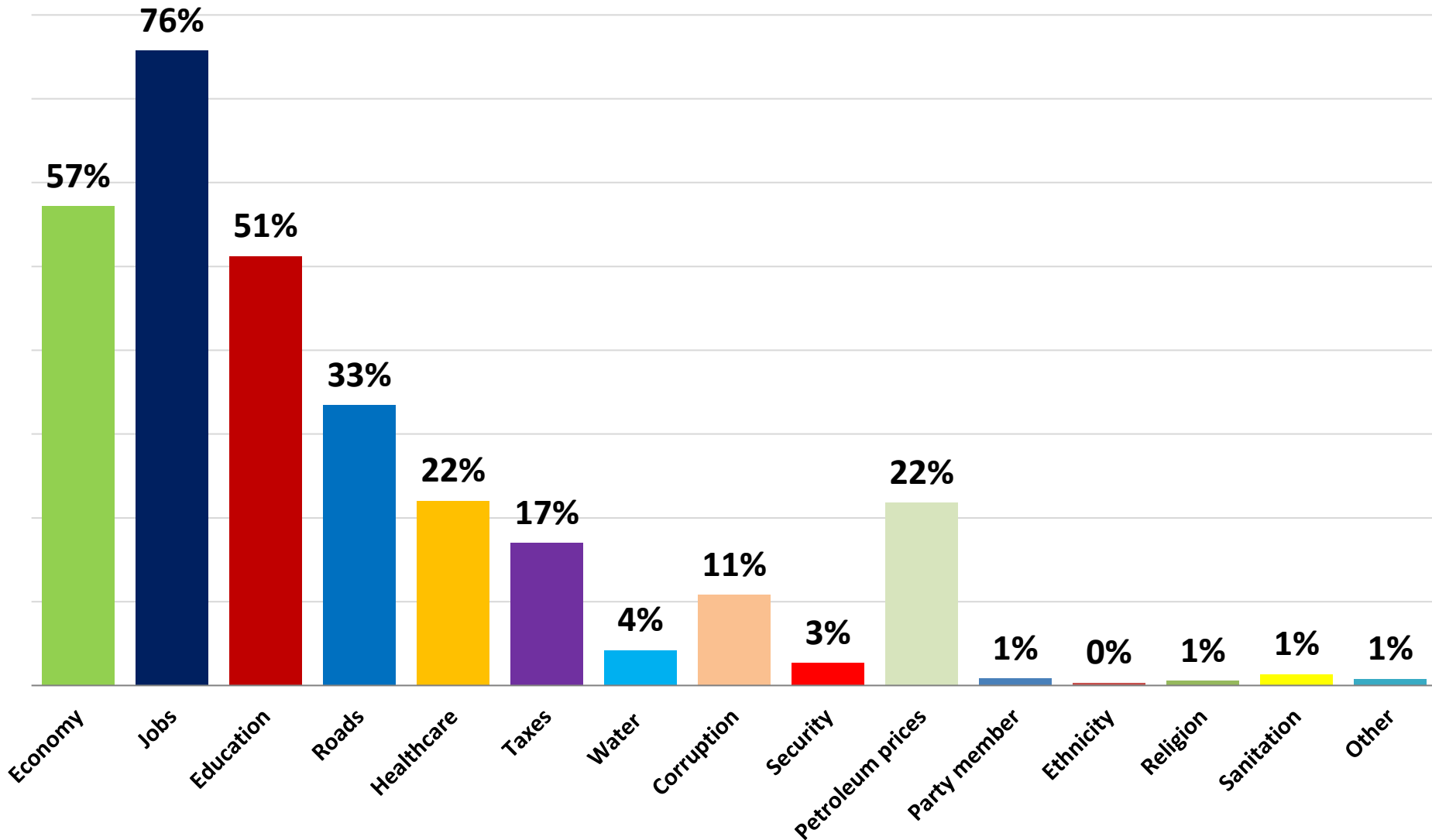
Which of the following running mates do you believe can do a better job as vice president if elected?



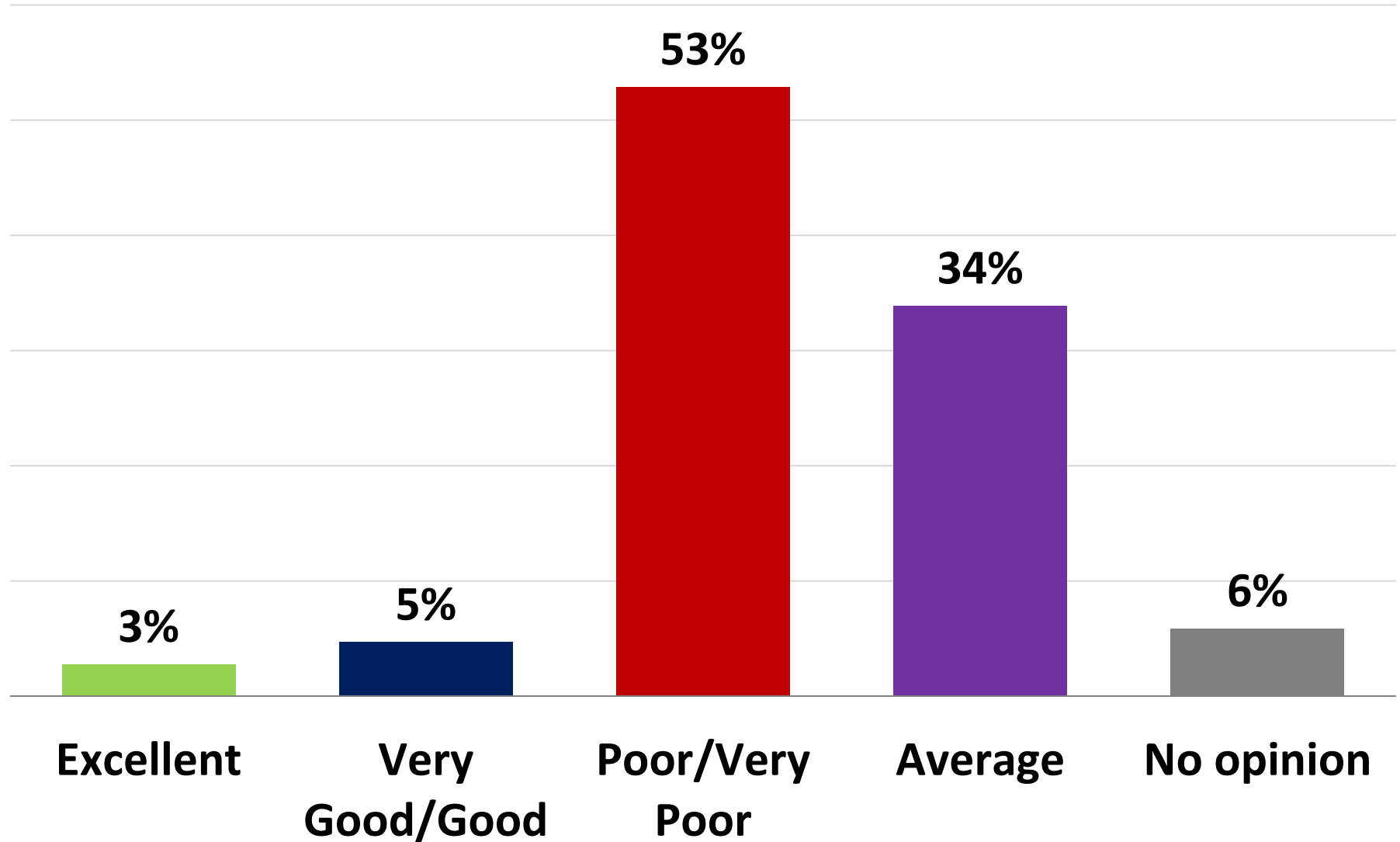
In your opinion, who is the best-ever and second-best head of state of Ghana who were democratically elected?



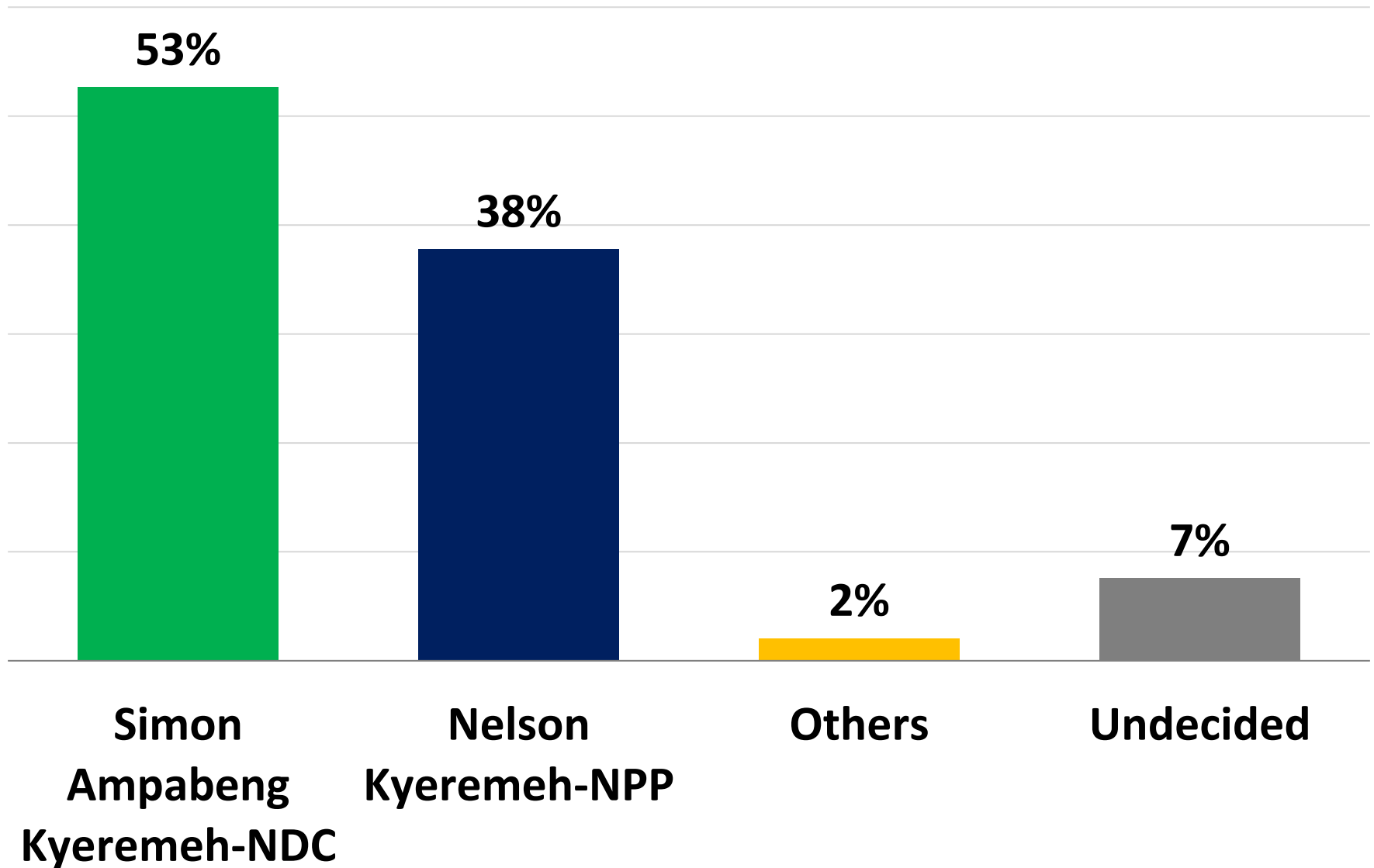

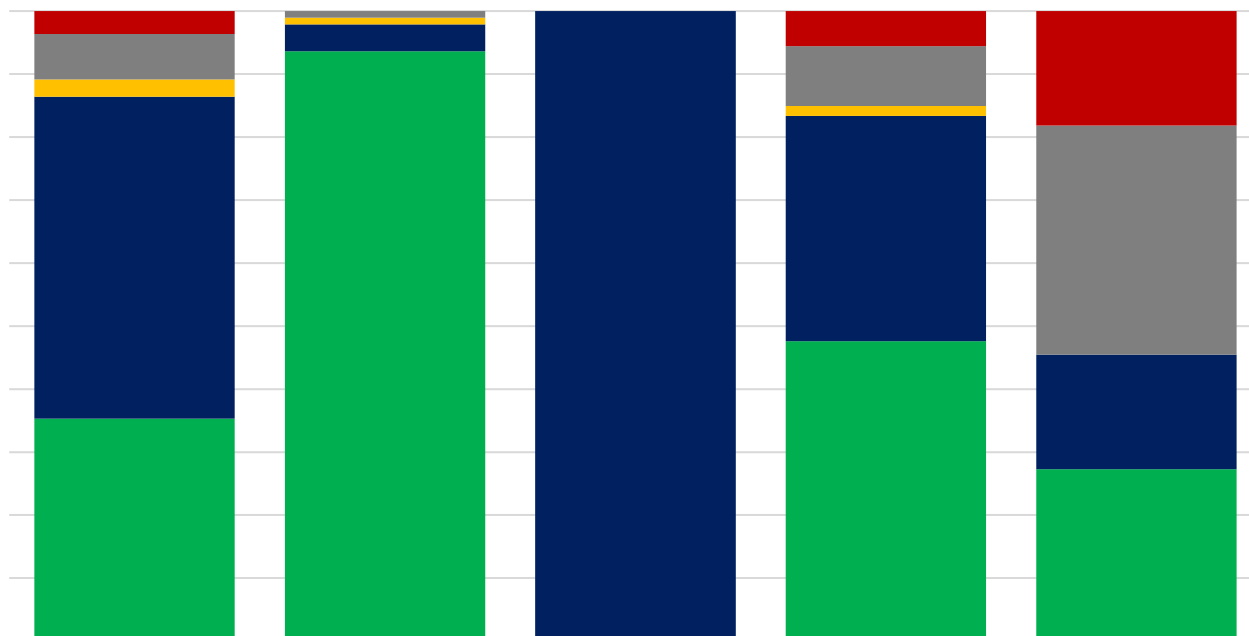
How would you rate the performance of your Member of Parliament?



Which of the following candidate do you intend to vote for in the 2024 parliamentary elections in Berekum East?

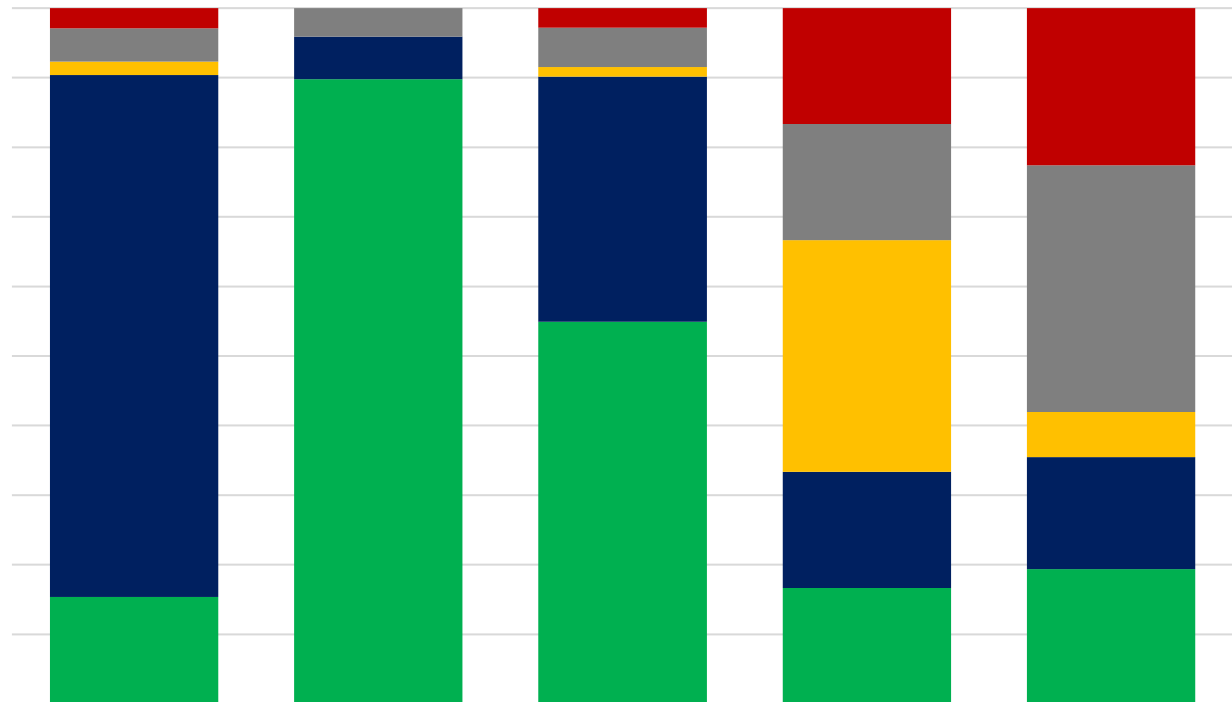

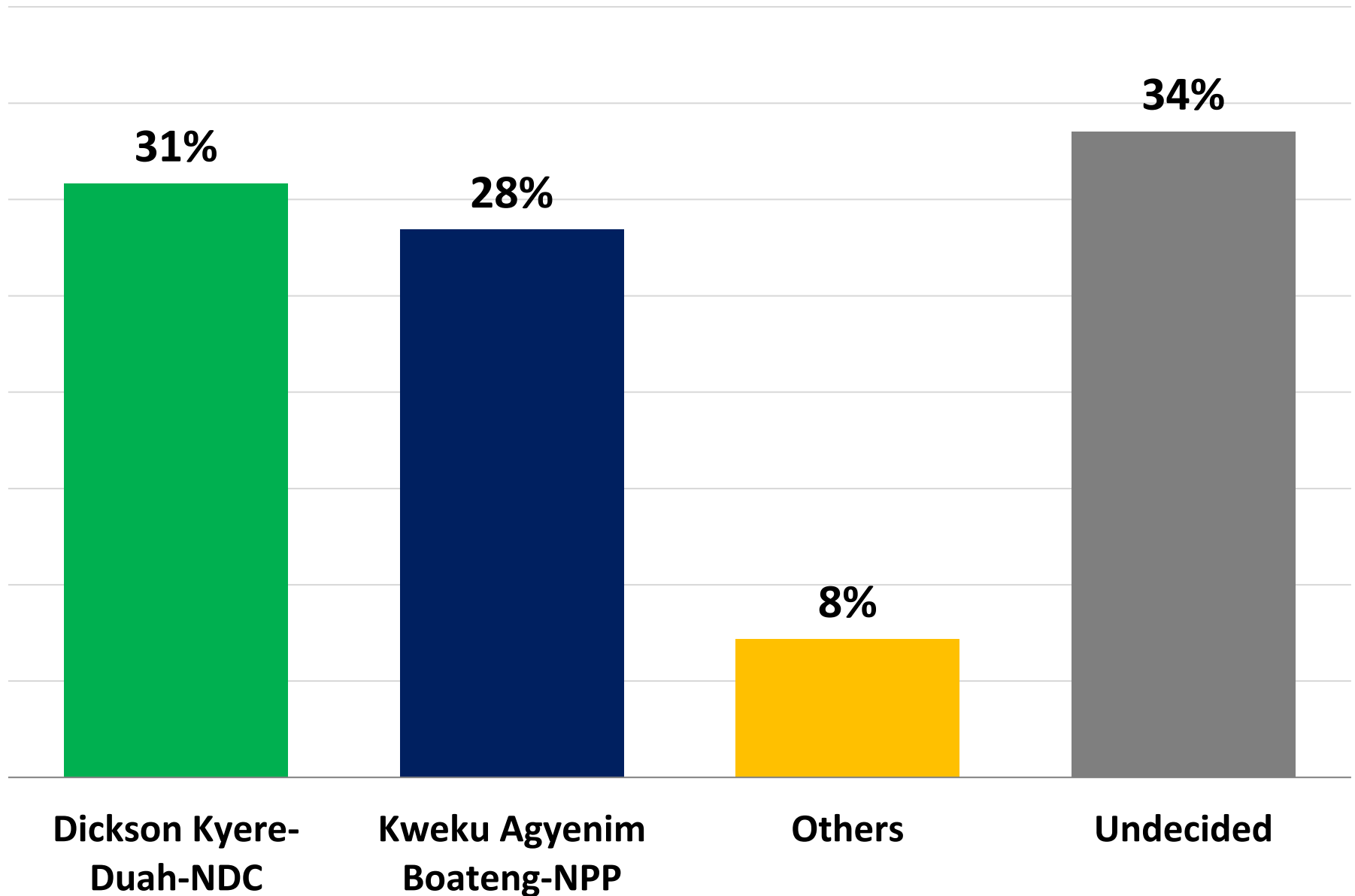

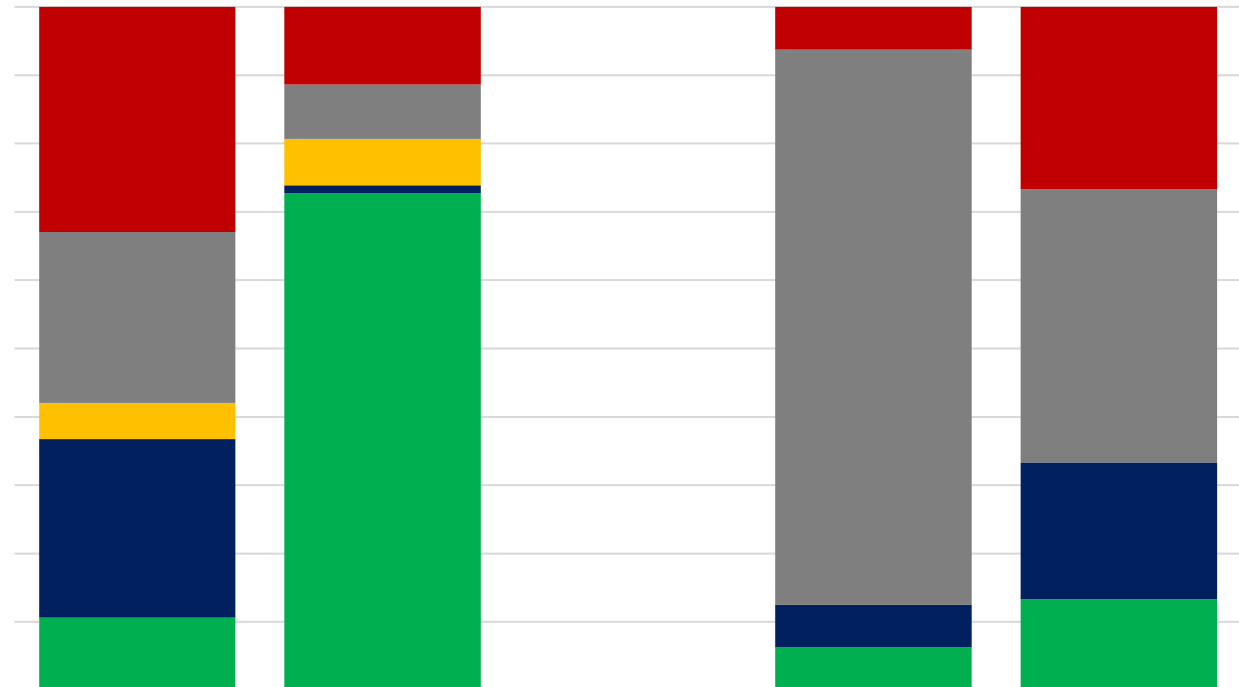

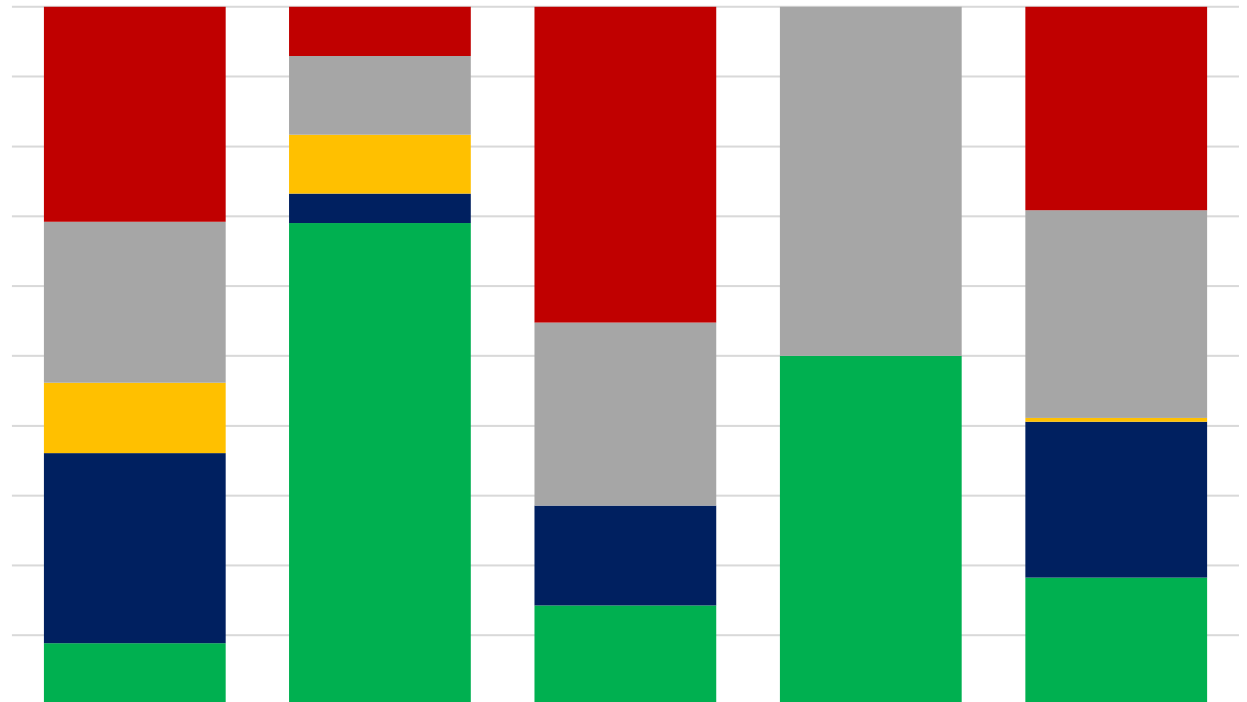

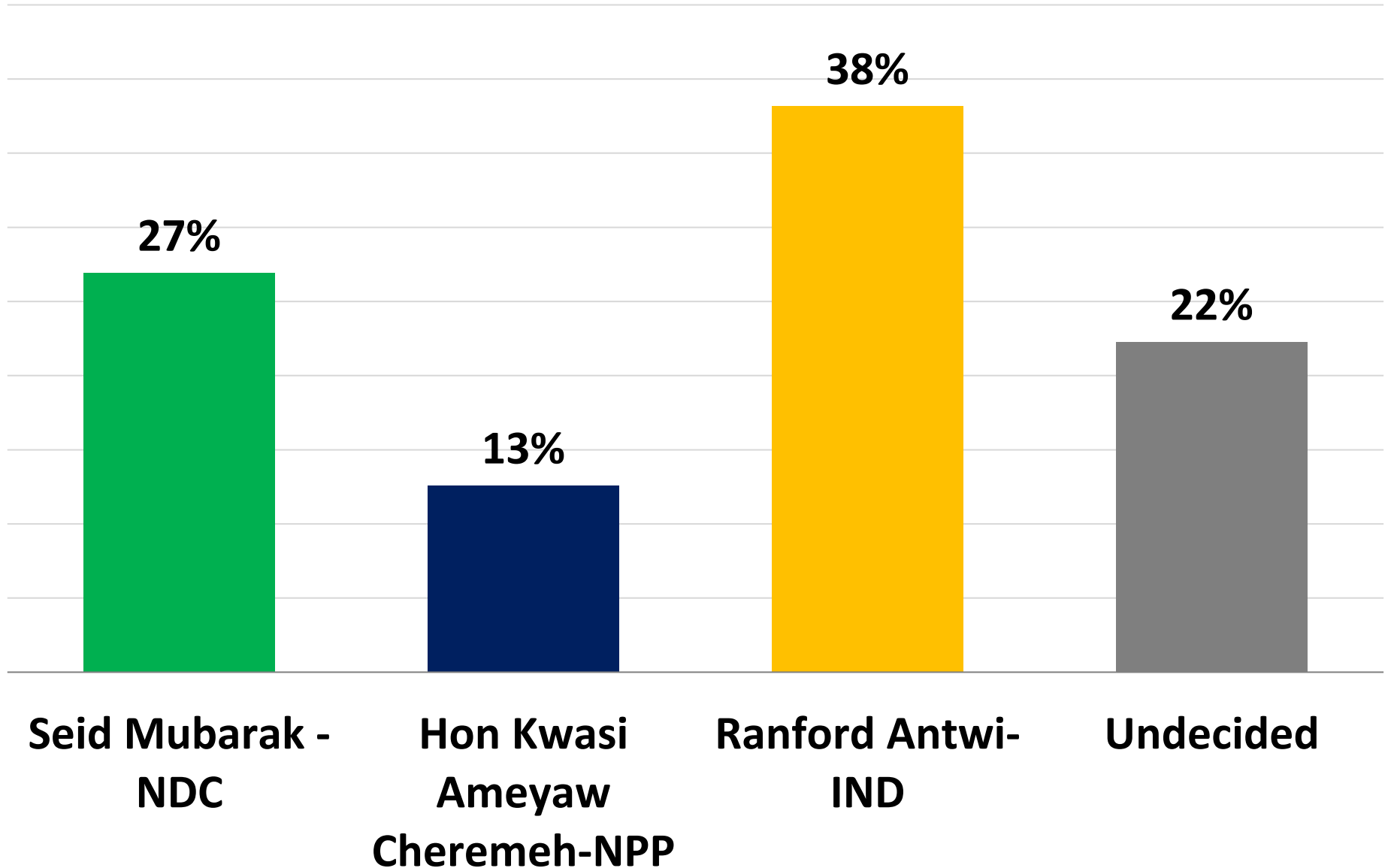

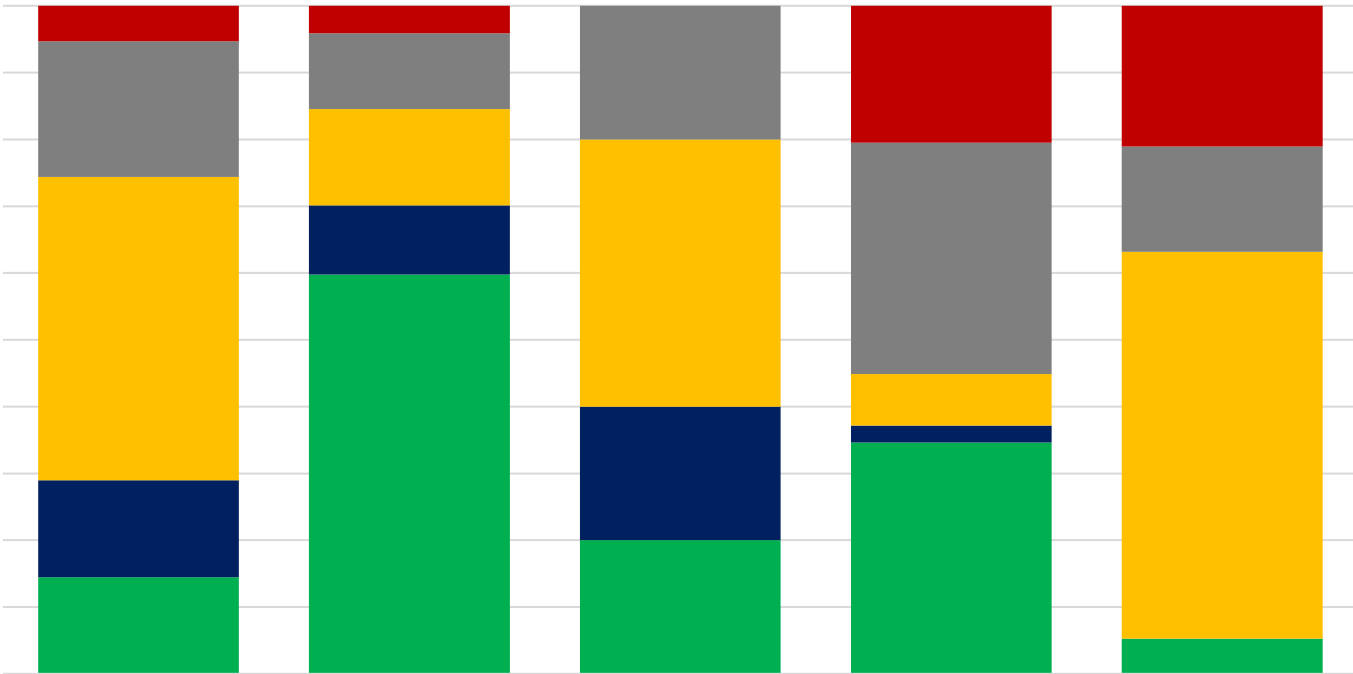

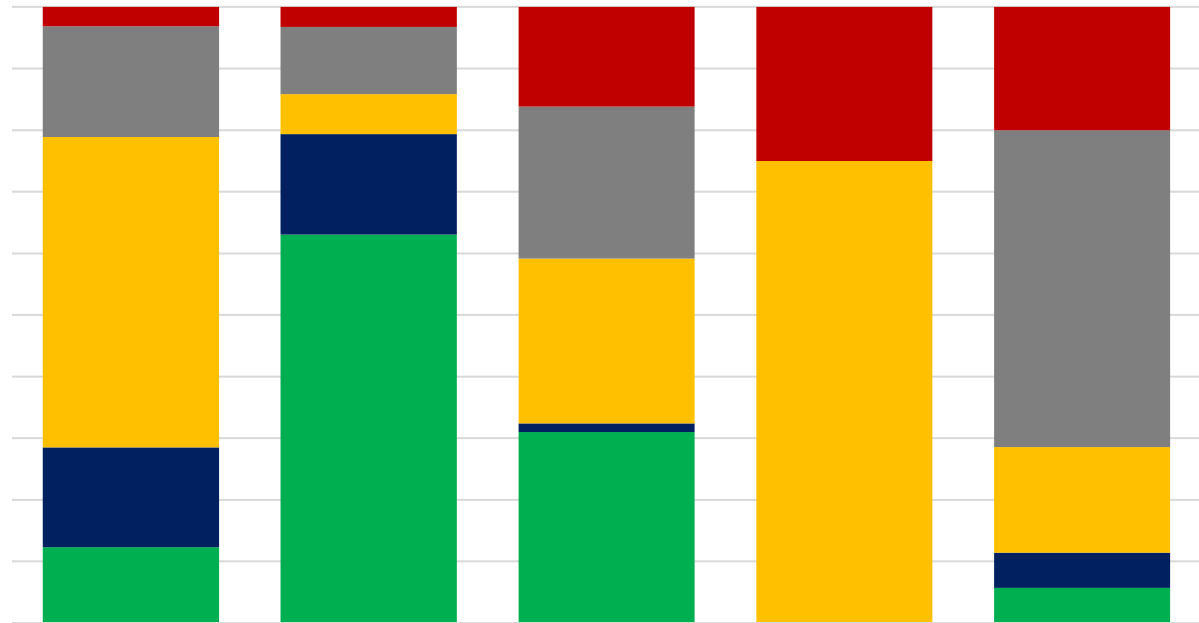

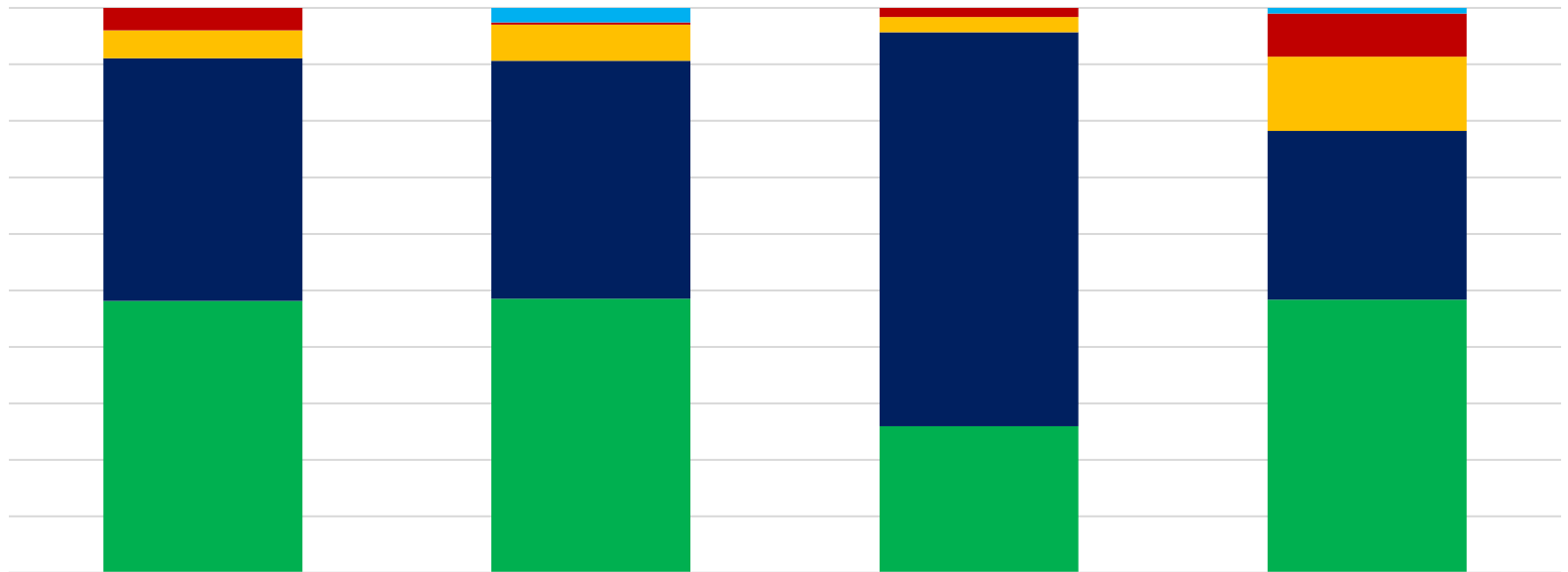

If the 2024 Elections were held today, who would you vote for? Berekum East, Berekum West, Sunyani West and Sunyani West

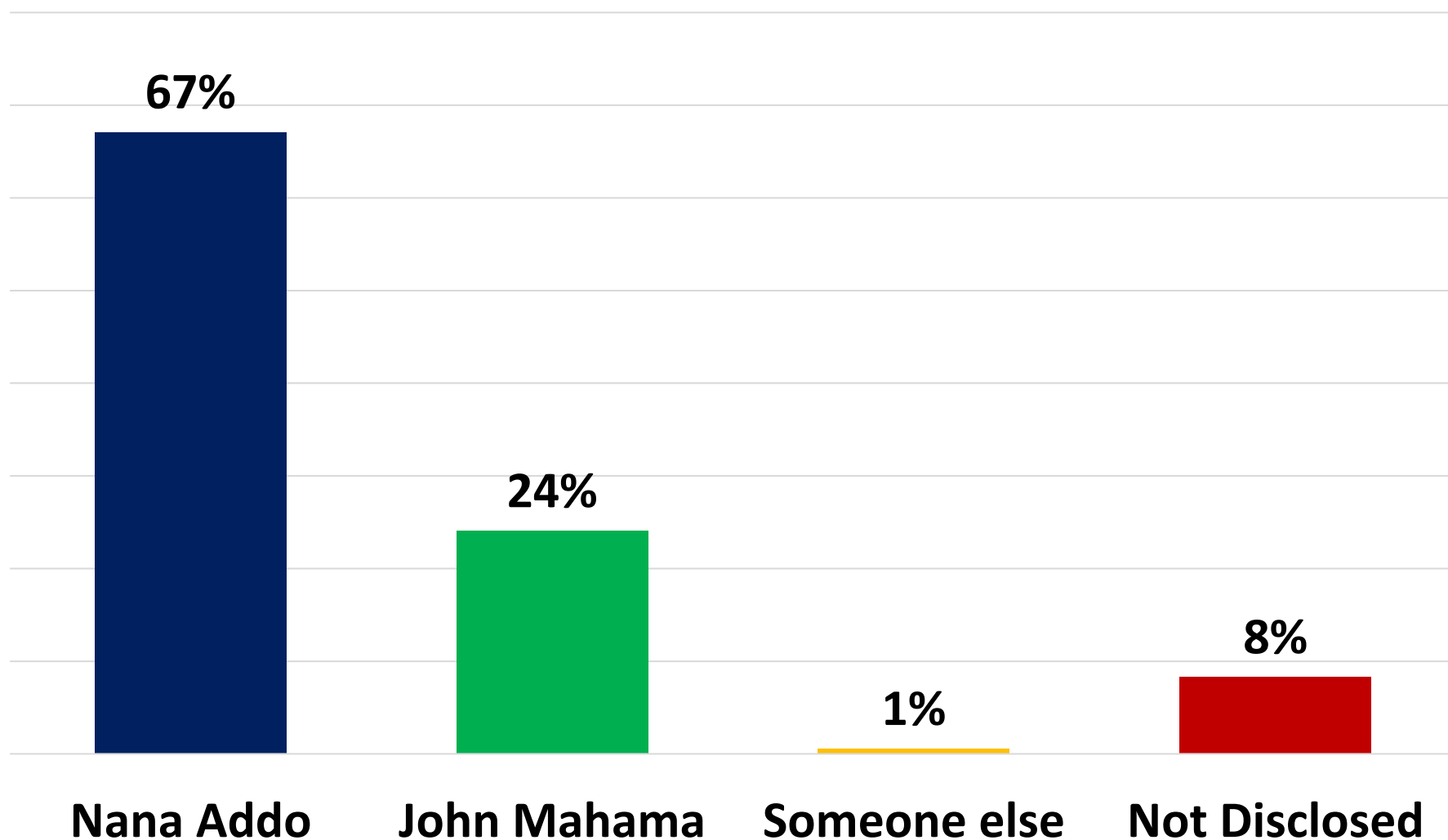

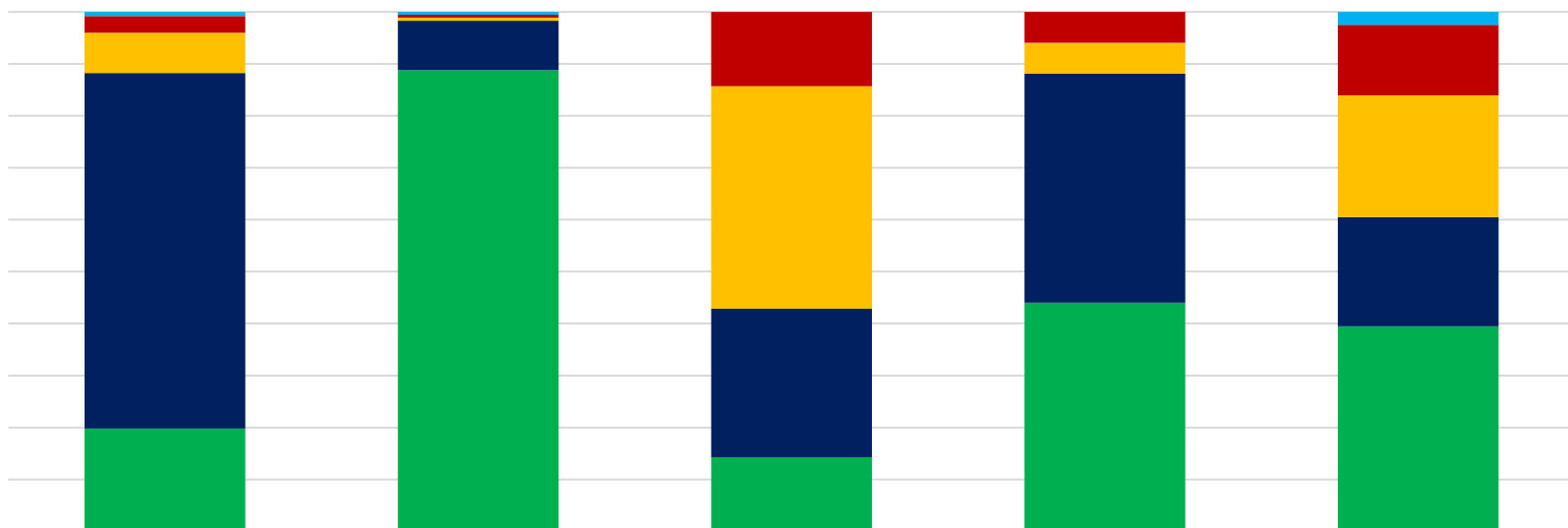

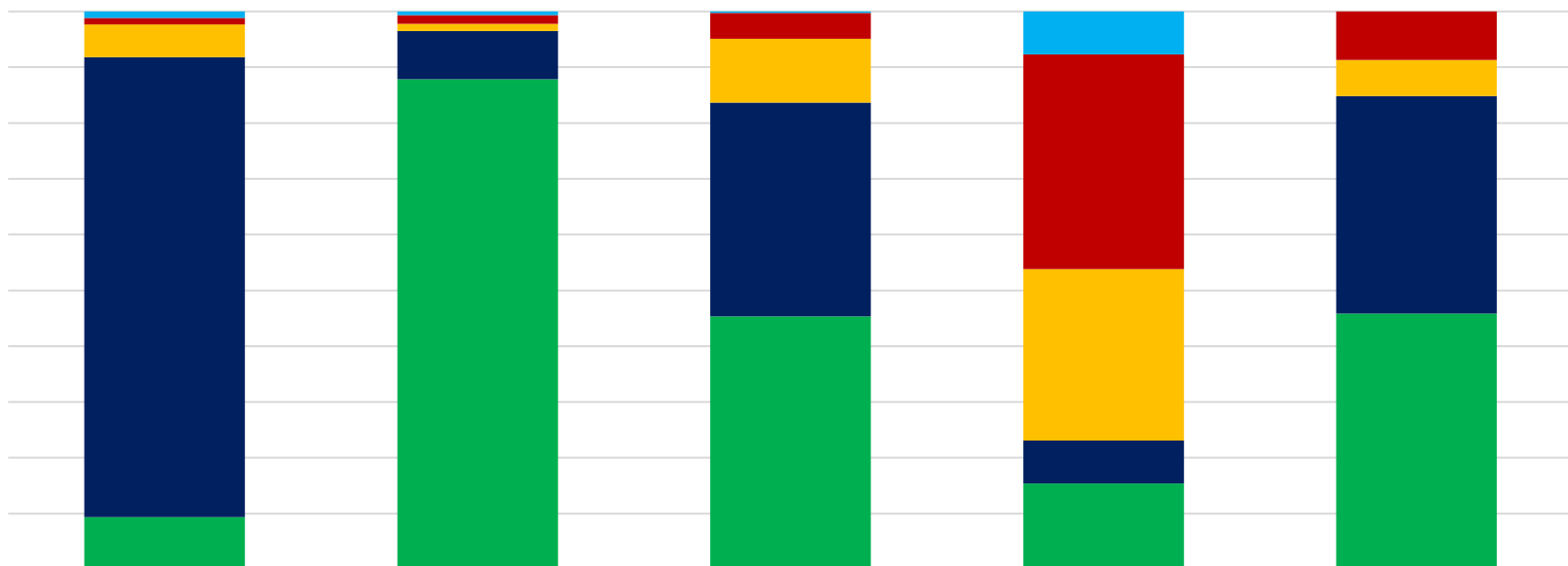

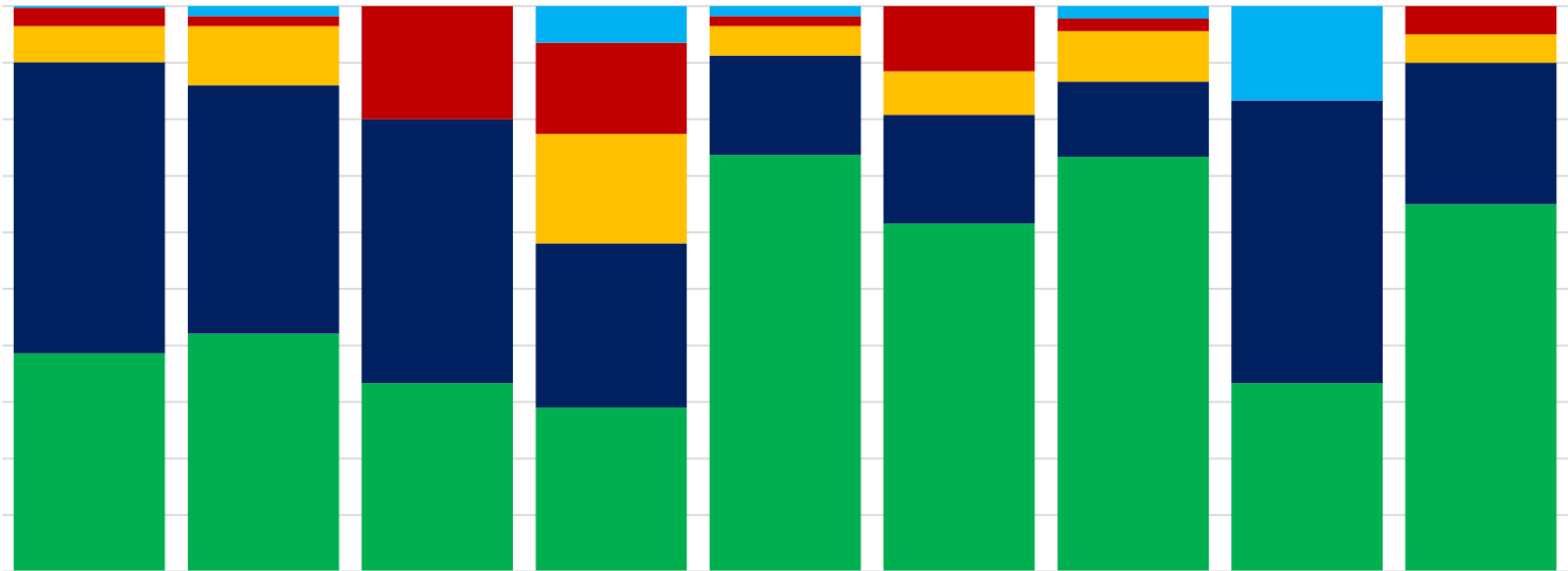

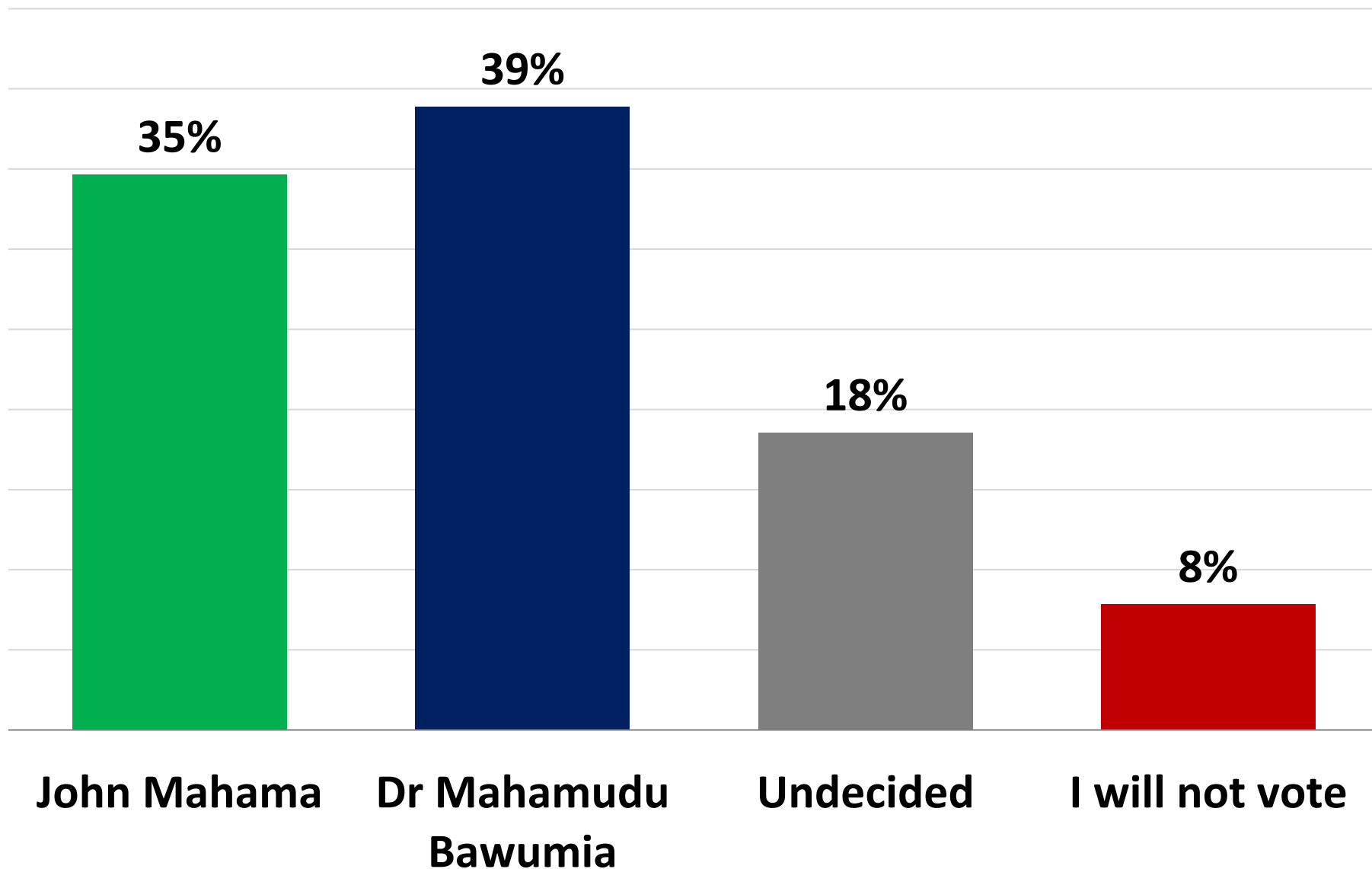

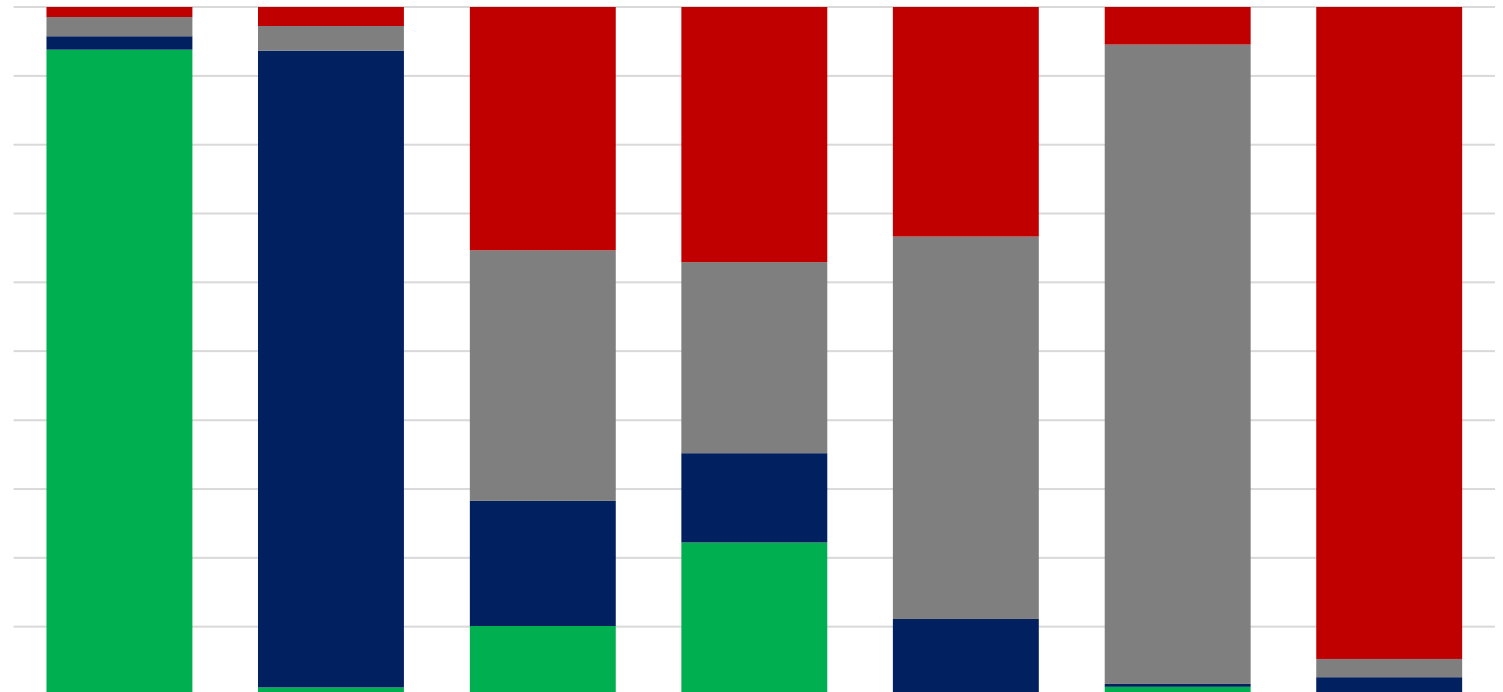

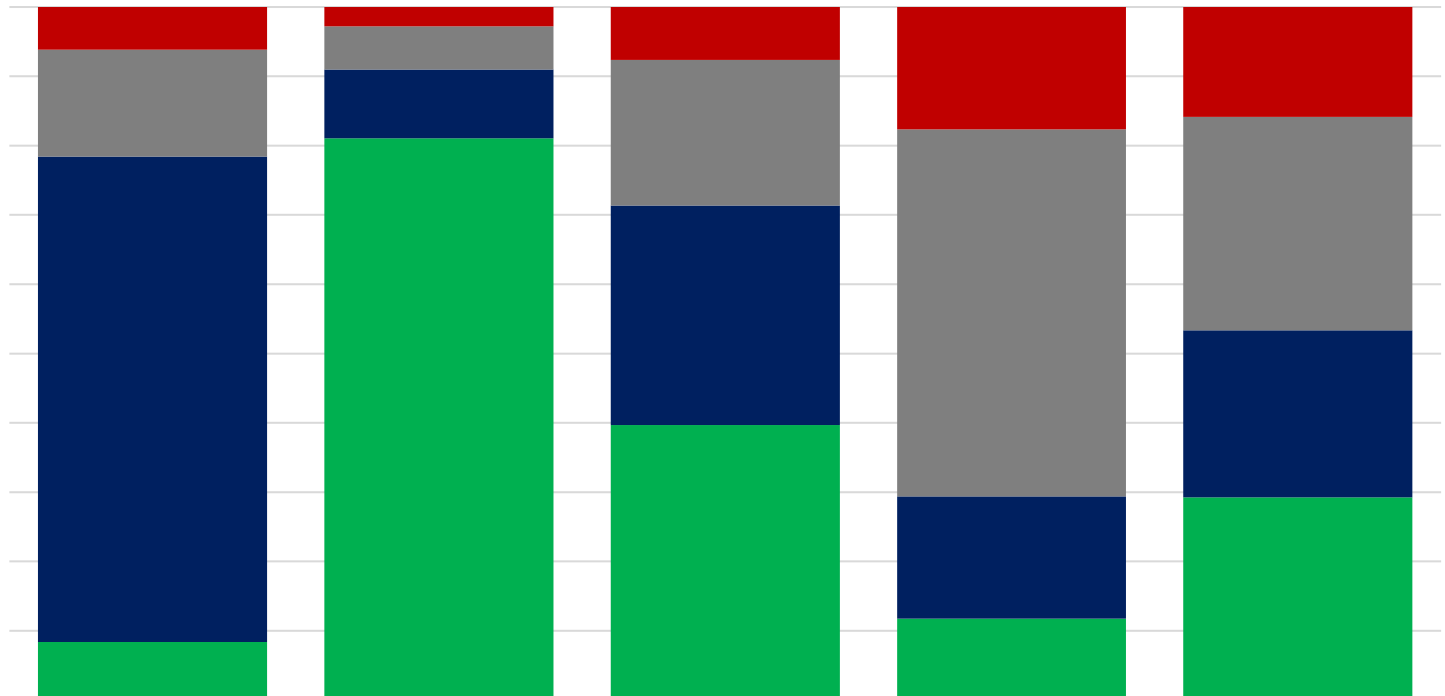

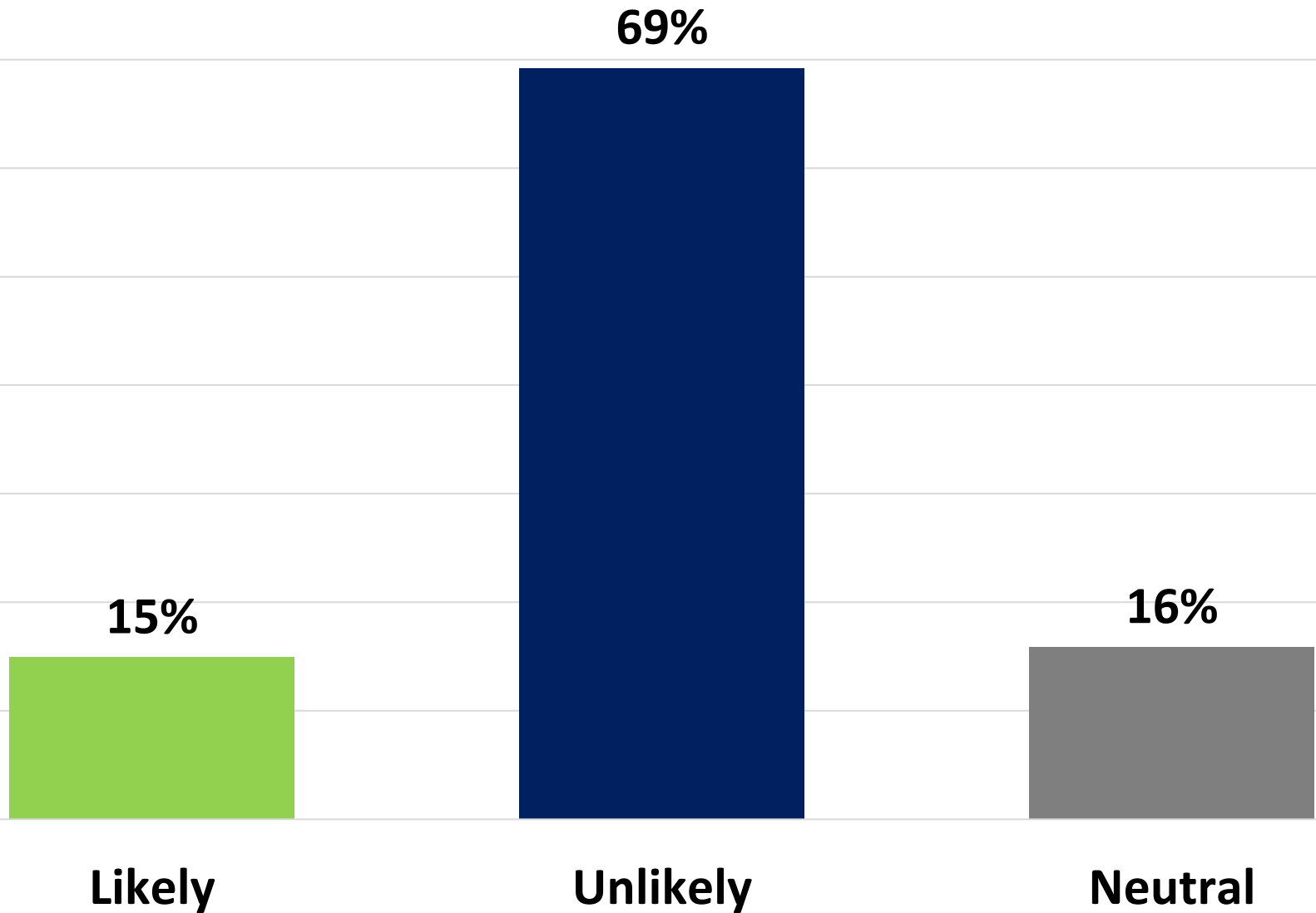

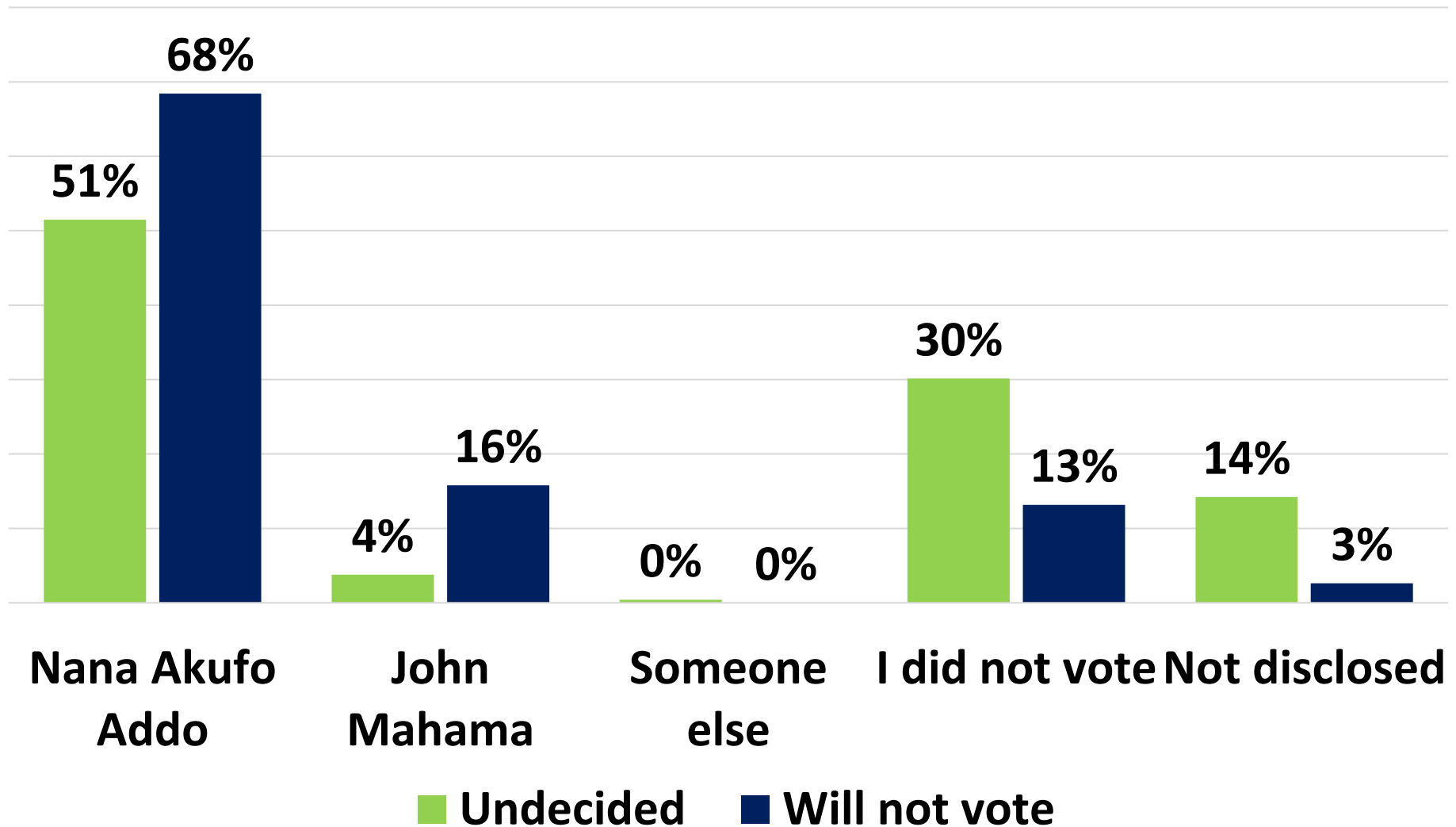
